1 tablespoon water 11/2 cups fine dry bread crumbs PREPARING THE FLUFFY

WHITE RICE: To make 3 lib-

eral cups of fluffy rice, put 1 cup

bring to a vigorous boil. Turn the heat as low as possible Cover saucepan with a lid and leave over this low heat for 14 minutes. Do not remove lid nor of tender rice, turkey and a bevy stir rice while it is cooking. Turn off the heat.

Use exact measurements of uncooked rice and water. Time the cooking accurately. For real convenience and economy of time and effort, keep unused rice in the refrigerator in a covered container at all times. Use it for many quick, delicious and inexpensive soups, salads, casserole dishes, hot breads and desserts.

METHOD: Mix together the rice, turkey, soup, parsley, onion, lemon rind, salt and pepper. Chill thoroughly in the refrigerator. Shape into 8 croquettes, using 1/2 cup of the croquette mixture to make each croquette. Roll the croquettes first in the bread crumbs, then into the eggs which have been mixed with the water, and again into the crumbs. Chill before frying. Fry in deep fat (380° F.) until crisp and brown. Drain on absorbent

Serve the croquettes hot with a gravy or a sauce as desired. This recipe makes 8 servings.

Record Grain Crop Moved On CN Lines



J. R. McMillan, vice-president of CNR's western region, said today "this is 18,216 cars more than we moved in the similar period of the last crop year."


At an average of 1,906 bushels per car, this means the CNR transported more than 183 million bushels of grain during the past six months, Mr. McMillan
