PRACTICE OR PRAYERS?

Ben Hogan spent countless hours on the practice fairway and on the putting green, perfecting his golf until he became a precisionist. To him, practice was not work, it was fun, for he was consumed with a burning desire to come as close to perfection as was humanly possible. He was never satisfied. On one occasion when he won the American Open Golf Championship, he recalled his bad shots and headed for the practice tee again while others were celebrating.

Gordon Hudson, the only skip to pilot a rink to two consecutive Canadian curling titles, made the statement that if a curler worked "as hard as his game as a golfer like Ben Hogan, and had nine months of artificial ice to do it, he could achieve astounding shot-making skill on the ice. I believe this sincerely.

It is true that curling is not a professional sport, but it is also true that too few curlers work at their game in practice sessions. One of the reasons for Ken Moir's success as a coach of High School curlers is his insistence that his boys do very little else but practice during the first year.

In three hours of practice you can deliver more stones than in one year of club play.

"How can I practice," you say, "when curling ice is in use all day?" Remember there are still 24 hours in a day and if you really want to practice, do what many of us did when we loved to be on the ice... acquaint yourself with game schedules in your club and even if you have to play cribbage with the ice-maker and stay up after midnight or climb in through a window - get out on the ice and practice, practice, practice, until you get a feeling of confidence when you are sitting in the back that you can make any shot in the book.
