## — NAVY NEWS — Wrens Put Out to Sea For Practical Training

"Slip and proceed at 2030!" That order was followed Wednesday night as Chatham's tender, HMC Tug Marysville eased away from the jetty and headed into the harbor with a crew of nine Wrens for practical instruction in "rules of the road" and in operating the helm.

Completely manned by reserve personnel, under the command of Lt. Cdr. T. Johnstone, the Marysville cruised the harbor

while all Wrens took turns at the helm and saw at first hand why rules of the road are necessary.

After a short time at the wheel the girls were adept at steering a straight course by compass and answering all helm orders with the correct action.

ABMM1 Jimmy Olsen showed the Wrens through the small engine room with its noise and rumes, dials and gauges and briefly explained the engine and pumping system.

Practical instruction of this type is certainly far more interesting than the classroom and books. A period of training at a naval base during the summer is the last part of the overall training plan for Wrens.

# ALTERNATIVE VOTING AND HOW TO MARK YOUR BALLOT IN THIS PROVINCIAL ELECTION

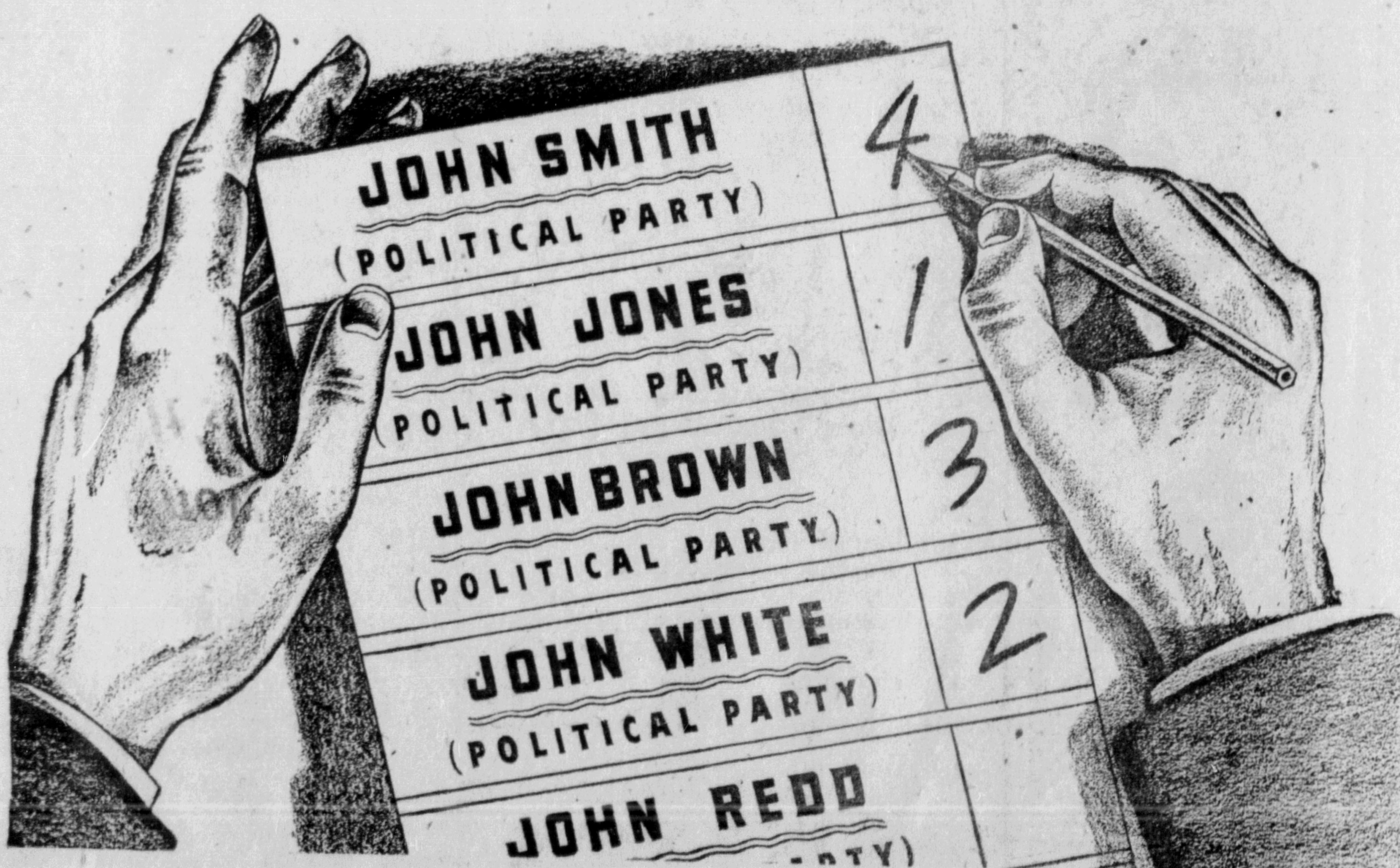
## HERE'S WHY THE NEW SYSTEM IS BEING USED

## HERE'S HOW YOU VOTE WITH ALTERNATIVE VOTING

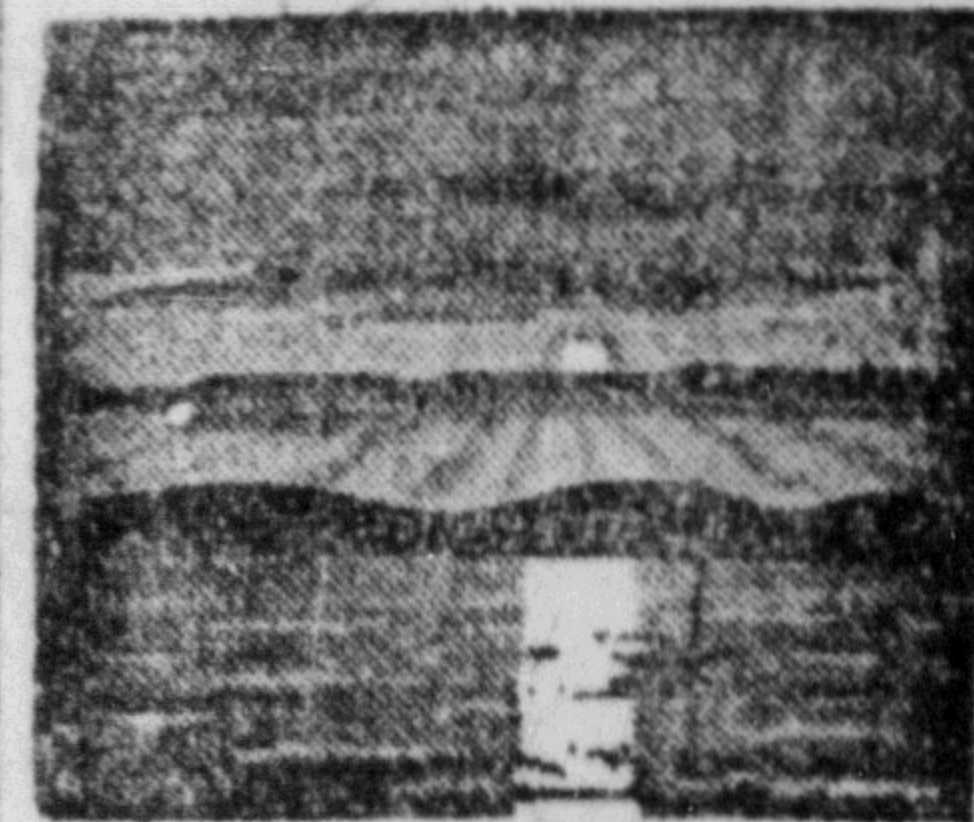

### Prince Rupert's Big Crane Going to Naval Dockyard—Dispute Unsettled

The great 75-ton crane which the United States government erected on the Prince Rupert waterfront, at the west end of the ocean dock, during the war is now in process of being dismantled and will be removed to Victoria where it will be re-erected at the naval dockyard.

cern of Victoria has been carrying out the dismantling and the W. H. Smith wrecking company south by barge. One of the largest cranes on the coast, and reputed to have cost possibly a million dollars to put up, hopes had been held for some years that it might be retained as a local waterfront facility. However, no use developed for it and now it is going. It is one of the last remaining war assets here to be disposed of.
