1 1/2 cup currants; 1 1/2 cup raisins; 1/4 cup citron peel, sliced paper-thin; 1/4 cup candied orange peel, sliced; 1/4 cup almonds, blanched and toasted; 1/4 cup rendered suet, chopped; 1/4 cup fine dry bread crumbs; 1 egg; 1/2 cup milk; 1/4 cup ROGERS' GOLDEN SYRUP; 1/4 cup all-purpose flour; 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg; 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon; 1/4 teaspoon cloves; 1/4 teaspoon salt.
