TERRACE — A promise of a first-hand survey of Highway 16, by works minister P. A. Gaglardi was received by the Terrace and District Board of Trade at its quarterly meeting here.

In letters to the board, Mr. Gaglardi promised early information on the proposed location survey of the Terrace-Kitimat road, and a visit to Terrace, during the present session, to see "at first hand" the condition of Highway 16 and other district roads.

Herb Spencer, industrial committee chairman, won support of the meeting in a motion that the Western Steel Company of Canada be contacted with the suggestion that a steel smelter be built here, due to the large iron ore potential.
