Reds Reject 'Flexible' Agenda

PANMUNJOM (AP)-American Ambassador Arthur H. Dean today proposed a "flexible" agenda to speed up talks for arranging a Korean peace conference, but the Communists immediately rejected it as "sleight-of-hand."

The diplomats debated an hour and three minutes, got nowhere for the sixth straight day, and called it quits until Monday. Dean told reporters he was not

depressed over the lack of headway in his week of talks with the Communists to set up the Korean peace parley.

He still felt the Reds wanted surprising that it has taken us some time to get shaken down on a working basis."

Dean proposed a "flexible or un-numbered agenda" under which the negotiators could skip around among various problems that must be settled before the political conference can convene.
