HOCKEY GREATS

One-time shining stars of hockey were among 460 leading personalities of the sports world, ranging in age from 17 to 72, who attended in Toronto the first annual \$25-a-plate sports celebrity dinner of the Ontario Sports Writers and Sportcasters Association. Proceeds of about \$10,000 went to the Ontario Society for Crippled Children. Here, left to right, are: Joe Malone, centre of the old professional Quebec Bulldogs 30 years ago, who scored more than 400 goals in his brilliant hockey career; Aurel Joliat, the 135-pound "Mighty Mite" who teamed with Howie Morenz on the Montreal Canadiens for 10 years; Bill Cook, now New York Rangers coach who built a reputation as one of the greatest right-wingers of all time while with the Rangers 1926-36; E. C. (Newsy) Lalonde, who from 1905 to 1926 played big-league hockey or lacrosse in Montreal, Toronto, Regina, Saskatoon, Vancouver and New York; and Frank (King) Clancy, considered one of the greatest inspirational leaders to lace on a skate as a hockey player.

Boston Cinches Play-Off Spot; Milt Schmidt's 200th Counter

BOSTON (Canadian Press) — Boston Bruins Tuesday night cinched fourth place in the National Hockey League and a berth in the Stanley Cup play-offs by blanking Chicago Black Hawks 4 to 0.

Captain Milt Schmidt of Boston scored the 200th goal in his National Hockey League career. Schmidt celebrated a "Schmidt-Dumart Appreciation Night" by combining with Dumart and Bobby Bauer for his 200th marker at 12:58 of the second period to put Boston into a 2-0 lead.

Bauer returned from five years in National Hockey League retirement to reunite the famed Kitchener forward line which first played together in 1936.

The Bruins beat out the New York Rangers for fourth place and the final play-off spot.

The win increased the margin of the Bruins over the idle New York Rangers to seven points with two games of the regular schedule remaining. The Rangers have three games to play but could not catch the Bruins even if they won them all.

It was Boston's sixth straight game without a loss and goalie Jim Henry's seventh shut-out of the season.

Tonight Toronto Maple Leafs and Montreal Canadiens meet in a critical game for runner-up position.

Neither the Maple Leafs or the Canadiens are keen on remaining in third place for, in that spot, they would have to meet the powerful Detroit Red Wings in the semi-finals. Naturally, it would be easier to be pitted against the Boston Bruins or the New York Rangers, whichever gets into fourth place.

The Maple Leafs pulled to within one point of the second place Canadiens during the week-end, the Leafs winning two games while the Canadiens lost a pair.

In week-end games, which had no effect on standings, the Detroit Red Wings, league leading team, twice downed the last place Chicago Black Hawks, 6 to 1 Saturday night and 4 to 0 Sunday. Detroit has long since been assured of finishing first and Chicago cannot escape the cellar.

Four goals in the second and third periods after New York had built up a 2 to 0 lead enabled the Leafs to win Sunday before 16,537 New York fans.
