

An official says two methods ration have been successfully tested—evaporation and freezing. Through evaporation, a fairly heavy beer can be reduced to one-quarter its volume and still retain a full and satisfying flavor. .

The same reduction is possible with freezing. Under this method the beer is frozen and the ice removed, leaving the strong concentrate.

The official said the concentrates produced both by freezing and evaporation have been successfully stored for more than




