Drilling For Uranium To Start Soon in Atlin
VICTORIA 9.—Diamond drilling operations are expected to start soon to determine the value of a uranium discovery near Atlin in northern British Columbia, an official of the department of mines reported.
Kenneth Blakey, a gold commissioner sent to Atlin to handle the heavy rush of claims after the initial discovery June 23, said Conwest Exploration Co. has started a road into the most promising area 10 miles north-west of Atlin and that drilling should start shortly.
About 350 claims, many of them speculative, have been staked by Conwest and individuals from Atlin, Carcross, B.C., and Whitehorse, Y.T., on the west side of Atlin lake about 20 miles south of the B.C.-Yukon border.
The claims run in a strip which varies in width from 2 1/2 to five miles and is almost 15 miles long.
Both Mr. Blakey and Dr. J. F. Walker, deputy minister of mines, said it was not known what the value of the discovery, B.C.'s third, will be. It is the first discovery of pitch-blend, the richest producer of uranium, made in the province.
Conwest has at least 32 claims in the area and is reported to be considering buying others.
