\$1 Million Per Day Spent On Oil, Gas Development

EDMONTON — About \$1,000,000 a day is being spent in Western Canada on oil and gas development and Canada as a

whole should be self-sufficient in oil possibly within five years, R. H. C. Harrison of Calgary said Monday.

Mr. Harrison, president of the Canadian Petroleum Association, addressed more than 1,000 engineers, geologists and others attending the annual meeting of the Canadian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy.

"In 1946," said Mr. Harrison, "there were some 20,000,000 acres being actively explored for petroleum and natural gas. At this time, there are over 150,000,000 acres. The timing is difficult to forecast but it would seem quite possible that within the next five years the Prairies will be capable of producing oil equal to Canada's requirements.

"During the current year, an average of some \$1,000,000 will be spent every day in the exploration and production of petroleum and natural gas in the West. This excludes the tremendous sums that are being spent in the building and expansion of pipelines, the building of petroleum chemical plants and expansion of refineries and marketing facilities."

Since 1947, the oil industry had spent \$1,000,000,000, or \$70 per capita, in exploration and development in the West. For that sum, Canadian oil reserves had been multiplied 40 times.

Premier E. C. Manning of Alberta outlined oil and gas development in the province. He said much of the money invested had come from the United States and that influx of capital had had a lot to do with the present favorable position of the Canadian dollar with respect to U.S. money.

Indians to Demand Share Of Provincial Sales Tax

VICTORIA (CP) — British Columbia Indians will demand a share of the provincial sales tax revenue for development of their reservations.

A resolution to this effect will be presented at the convention of provincial tribes from mainland points and Vancouver Island at a convention at Hazelton, April 25. More than 300 delegates will attend.

Provincial Labor Minister Lyle Wicks, as well as officials from the federal fisheries and Indian affairs departments will attend the meeting.

Among resolutions to be submitted to the floor of the convention is one asking that the Indians be given the same liquor rights in the province as the white men.

Another resolution will ask that Indians be exempted from paying income taxes.

The Indians claim that in accordance with the terms of the union between British Columbia and the federal government, they were to be treated as "liberally" as they were under the British government. Under direct crown rule they were exempt from taxation.

INCOME TAX QUIZ

Q. Due to illness, I was confined to bed during the whole of 1952 and, consequently, required a full-time attendant. Can I include in my medical expenses the wages paid this full-time attendant?

A. In such a case the taxpayer has the option of claiming a flat deduction of \$500 from his income or including in his medical expenses the wages paid to such a full-time attendant.

Q. If my wife and I each earned over \$1000 and we have two children, ages 11 and 13, may we each claim one of the children and thus be entitled to a \$2000 exemption?

A. No. Since you and your wife each earned over \$1000, neither one is entitled to the additional exemption as a married person. If you wish to split the allowances for the children, you may each claim one child as a dependent and be entitled to an exemption of \$150 in addition to your basic exemption of \$1000.

Q. If my wife or dependents are living outside of Canada, do I have to give any additional information for purposes of claiming them as dependents?

A. The names and addresses of dependents supported by you during the year and living outside Canada should be given. In addition, some evidence of support, such as money order receipts, will be required and should be sent with your return.

Women Hold Several Top U.N. Positions

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. — Almost one-fifth of the professional posts in the United Nations Secretariat are held by women, a recent report by Secretary-General Trygve Lie shows.

Information on the part women play in U.N. work was requested by the U.N. Commission on the Status of Women.

A smaller proportion of women work in most U.N. Specialized Agencies, because few seek training in the highly specialized fields required, the report says.

Of the 19 "weather men" on the staff of the World Meteorological Organization, for example, one is a woman, the report says. Only five women are included among the 67-member professional staff of the International Tele-communication Union. In the World Health Organization (WHO), which numbers many nurses and pediatricians on its staff, however, women occupy more than 50 per cent of the professional posts.

At the beginning of the year, 16 women were members of permanent missions to the U.N., as compared with 332 men, the report notes. So far, no woman has been appointed a delegate to the Security Council.

Price of Milk To be Reduced

VANCOUVER (CP)—Two large Vancouver grocery chains announced Tuesday they intend to reduce the present price of milk in their stores by two cents May 1.

Canada Safeway said it would reduce the present price of 22 cents a quart and Super-Valu said it would meet the new price.

A Safeway official explained that the reduction would be on present delivered price, not two cents below any new price distributors might make when the provincial government decontrols milk above the producer level.

The B.C. Milk Board is expected to hand down a decision on a Safeway application for a Vancouver dairy plant licence in about 10 days.

The 20-cent milk will be sold in paper cartons.
