Bruce Brown Chosen Liberal Candidate

Arthur Bruce Brown, 43-year-old Prince Rupert last night won the nomination as Liberal candidate for the June 9 provincial election.

Mr. Brown's first bid in politics was as a school board trustee in British Columbia.

He assured the meeting that he would give "unstintingly" of his time and effort "during the campaign and following my election."

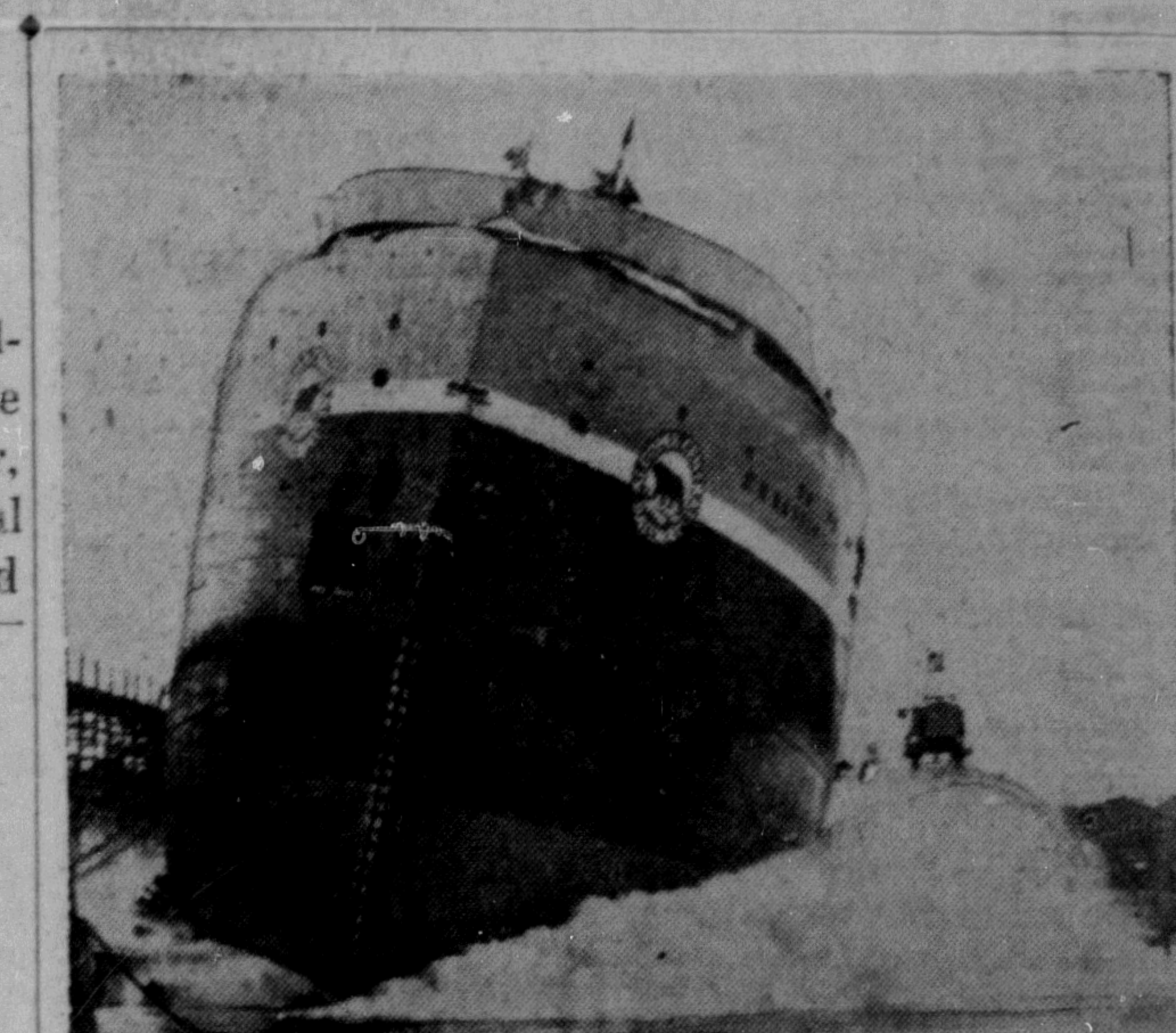
