

## Parents To Return Schoolroom Next Week

Education Week, and in Prince Rupert parents will be invited to return to schoolrooms at work during the week, and entertained at a luncheon.

Open house session will start Tuesday with both Borden Street and King Edward schools entertaining parents that afternoon. At King Ed, school youngsters will entertain at tea, with grade six girls serving, and proceeds earmarked for the Queen Alexandra Solarium. Parents will see the youngsters at work in classrooms. ## LETTERBOX

The Editor,  
The Daily News.

Let us consider where we stand as regards this great proposed power development north and west of us.

I contend Prince Rupert is the only logical place for that great power to be brought out to the sea. We are at least the most northern Canadian port south of the Alaska panhandle, with a good harbor with an easy approach for all and every deep sea vessel that floats.

Also I believe we are the terminus of a transcontinental railway although I may be wrong on this point as the CNR calls it a branch line.

Now let us look further into the merits of this proposal. Naturally the route of the high tension line is of vital concern. From Prince Rupert up the Naas Valley to a point where the Salmon river empties into the Naas is approximately 130 miles.

Here we strike the old Yukon telegraph trail from Salmon to Echo Lake, some 18 miles. Echo Lake to Telegraph Creek is 75 miles, Telegraph Creek to a point on the Taku River slope, 175 miles, for a total of 400 miles.

Certainly this is a long line but an easy line to build with no high mountains to cross and very easy valleys to follow. The only thing on a line like this would be the loss from the line itself.

A voltage of 350,000 is hard to hold but we must not forget that by following this proposed route, tremendous amounts of supplementary power could be developed to offset any line loss from the main source in the Atlin lake country.

The Naas valley alone could develop untold thousands of horsepower.

Now, have we a big enough harbor and sufficient coast line to accommodate a great industrial empire? From Barrett Rock to the Co-op is available, with 52 acres in the drydock site, all the north shore from Devil Island to Silver Creek and the inside of Digby Island.

It looks like a wonderful spot for development to us. Let us stress again the fact that we are the most northerly Canadian port south of Alaska for the free entry of deepsea vessels and always will be. To consider developing a great port through the Alaska strip is just nonsense.

Now, sir, I say, and say advisedly, that both the Dominion and provincial governments, before granting any water rights or hydro concessions, should take into careful consideration where we stand.

If the big Frobisher interests or the great Aluminum Company of America or any other company wishes to handle this vast proposition, make them bring it down into this country where it will do Canada the most good.

## Prime Minister Pays Tribute To Indonesian Independence

JAKARTA, Indonesia (C)—Canada's prime minister today placed a huge wreath at the foot of a simple white monument commemorating the 1945 declaration of independence by 80,000,000 Indonesian people.

The simple ceremony was performed by Prime Minister St. Laurent on a sun-bathed lawn in front of a white bungalow called "Independence House." Eight Indonesian leaders met there nine years ago and drafted their proclamation which later brought self-government to a string of tropical southwest Pacific islands extending more than 2,000 miles.

Earlier the Canadian leader, who arrived here Thursday night on his round-the-world goodwill tour after visiting India, Pakistan and Ceylon, called on Indonesia's prime minister, Ali Sastroamidjojo, who had greeted him on arrival at the airport here. He also called on Vice-President Mohammed Hatta. During his brief Indonesian stay—he leaves Saturday for Manila—the Canadian Prime Minister is the guest of President Soekarno, once leader of the Indonesian independence movement.
