Combination Light, Beacon Ready Shortly For Kitimat

A new combination light and radio beacon, designed to guide shipping into Kitimat and Ke-manah, will soon be complete and in operation.

N. A. Beketov, district marine agent for the Department of Transport, who has just returned from an inspection tour of light stations along the coast, reports that the new light on McInnis Island is nearing completion and should be in operation at the beginning of January.

Bruce Rogers, one-time executive of Columbia Cellulose here, will be lightkeeper at the new installation and has already left for McInnis Island to represent the department during the remainder of the construction project which started last March.

He was lightkeeper at Egg Island prior to joining Columbia Cellulose, and since leaving that firm has been at Green Island, 27 miles north of Prince Rupert.

The big installation at McInnis Island, in Laredo Sound, replaces an un-watched beacon which has been in operation for some years.

The new set-up will include a concrete building with tower to house a twin-diphone installation and machinery for a radio beacon. The twin fog alarm will be operated by compressed air.

There will also be two four-bedroom houses, one for the lightkeeper and family and one for the radio operator and family, and a two-bedroom house for the lightkeeper's assistant. Rounding out the small cluster of buildings will be a boat-house, landing platforms and storage space for fuel.

The building most advanced to date is the lightkeeper's

house, now roofed and insulated, which should be ready for occupancy next week.

Stewart and Slade Construction Co. Ltd., Vancouver contractors, should have the job completed by the end of the year, Mr. Beketov said, and in that case the light would go into operation at the beginning of January.

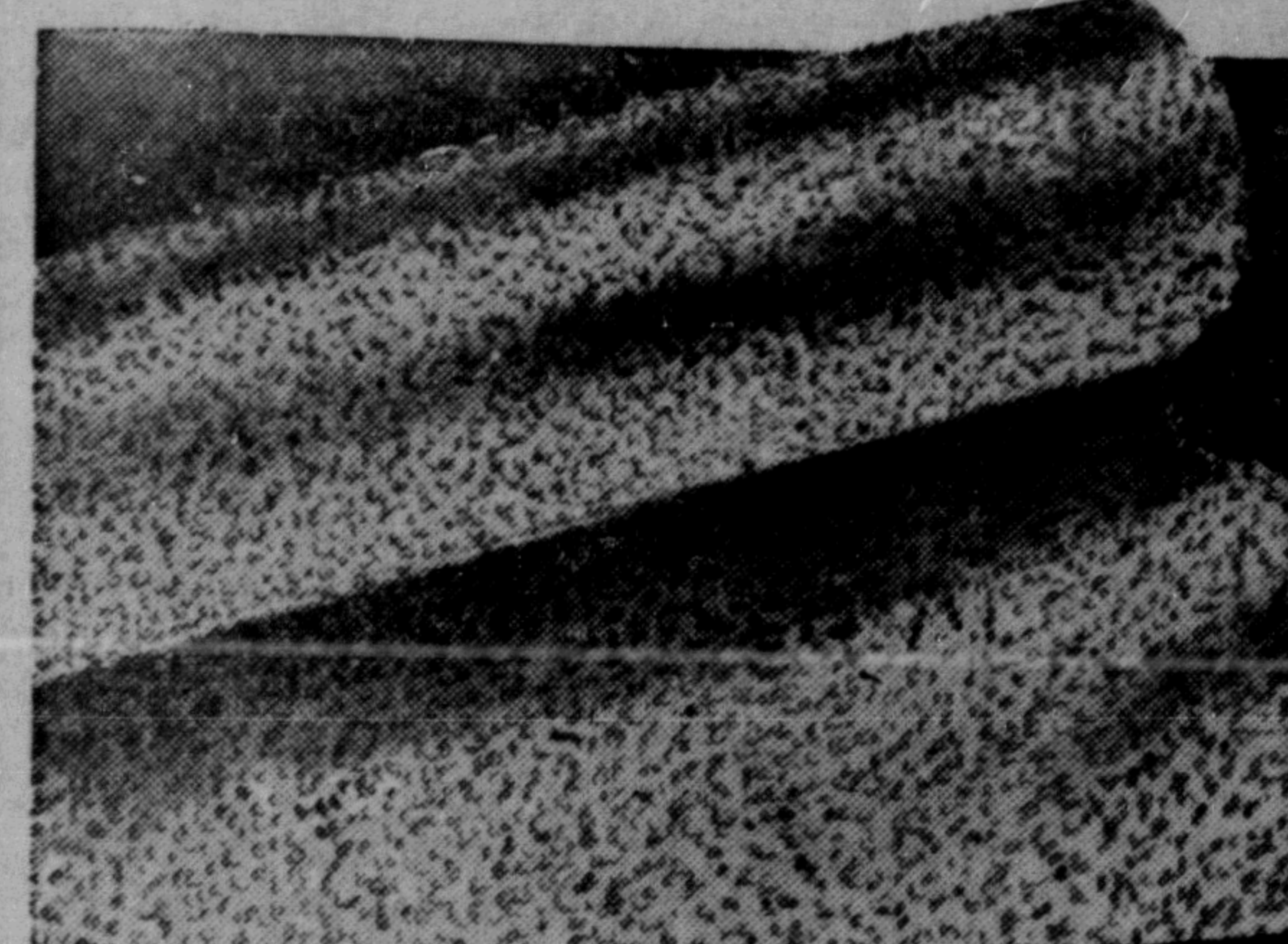

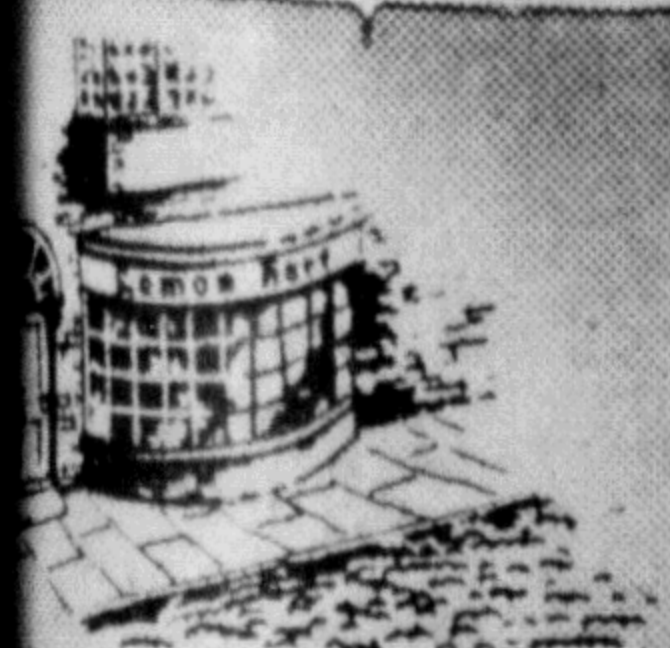
