Track Coach Takes Dim View Of Canada's Chance in BEG

 HALIFAX — Leigh Miller, who should know, doesn't think much of Canada's chances in track and field at the July 30-Aug. 7 British Empire Games at Vancouver. He rates Canada only a chance in the men's sprint relay and possibly in the two-mile race.

Miller, 49, and a native of nearby Elmsdale, N.S., is assistant coach of the Canadian track team. He still is rated as one of Canada's great indoor sprinters 24 years after he burned up tracks in North America.

"Our best chance at Vancouver is in numbers," he said in an interview. "We might pick up some fourths, fifths and sixths and we should be able to place well up in the final point totals."

Miller has beaten the best in his day and for a time was co-holder of the world's 100-yard record. He still likes to get out on the track with the youngsters and he still shows flashes of his old form.

Miller's records, in the sprints and on the boards, rate with Canada's tops. He was undefeated in outdoor competition in 1929 in Canada and the United States and was unbeaten the next year that time on the boards.

The wiry little sprinter three times tied the then world's 100-yard record of 9.3 seconds and 10 times covered the distance in 9.4.

He was Maritime sprint champion from 1925 to 1929, Ontario champ in 1929 and 1930; Canadian champion in 1930 and the same year won the North American sprint title.

In 1930 he was a member of the Canadian British Empire Games team that set a record of 42.1 seconds for the 400-meter relay. The same year he was picked as a member of the British Empire team to compete against United States athletes. Miller set an unofficial world's

120-yard record of 11 seconds and set a world record of 6.7 seconds in the 60 meters.

It was in these short distances that Miller's fast start and continuous drive gained him such fame.

Coaching is nothing new to him. He has handled both men's and women's track squads. Miller was coach of the Toronto Central YMCA team in 1934. A few years later he moved to Montreal where he coached the women's team at the Montreal Mercury Athletic Club and later was chairman of the Montreal District Federated Recreation Association which sponsored track and field meets in the communities surrounding Montreal.

Coming back to Halifax he took over Saint Mary's University team three years ago and last year was picked as coach of Nova Scotia's track team at the Canadian Olympic training plan school in Toronto.

He rates two Halifax sprinters, Bill Haley and Jim Warner, among the top four sprinters in Canada today.
