## Heavyweight Championship Fight Tonight

NEW YORK—Back from a five-day visit in the auto-racing country, the thought suddenly occurs that not once during the period did anyone mention either Ezzard Charles or Jersey Joe Walcott, the two fighting men who renew their long feud at Philadelphia tonight.

Indianapolis is not a backward city in any sense, and word almost certainly has reached the Hoosier capital by this time that the heavyweight championship of the world will be at stake. But the evidence is all to the contrary.

No one asked us whether we thought Ezzard would regain his crown or would get knocked on his pants again by the Camden, N.J. papa. Frankly, we wouldn't have known what to answer if they had asked, but their utter failure to do so is a blow to professional pride, nevertheless. We wouldn't tell those auto nuts

anything now if we had it right from the feedbox.

Joe Dobson, the veteran right-hander who has posted his seventh victory for Chicago White Sox, took a salary cut after a poor 1951 season. Far from letting it get him down, Dobson was the hardest working athlete in training camp this spring. Some days he was out there running, running long after his teammates had showered, determined to get that money back.

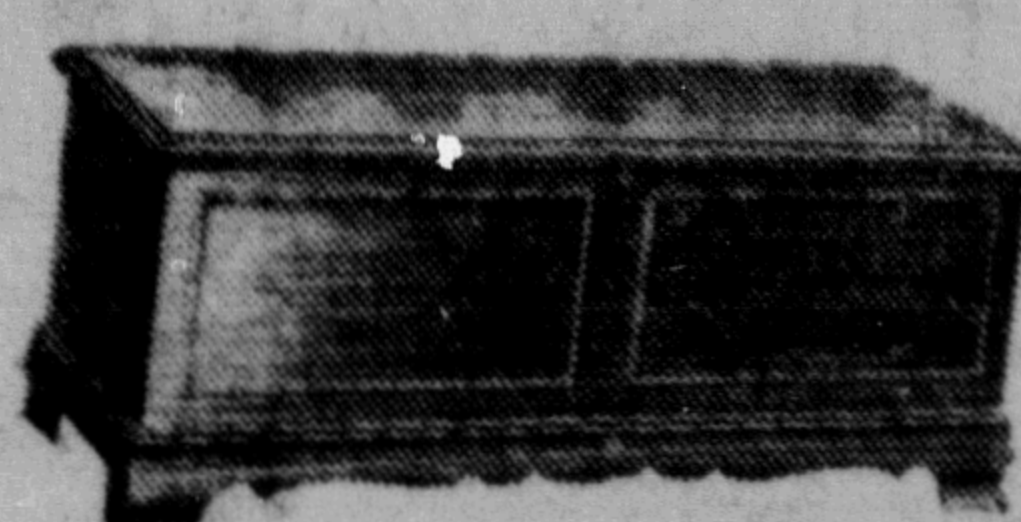

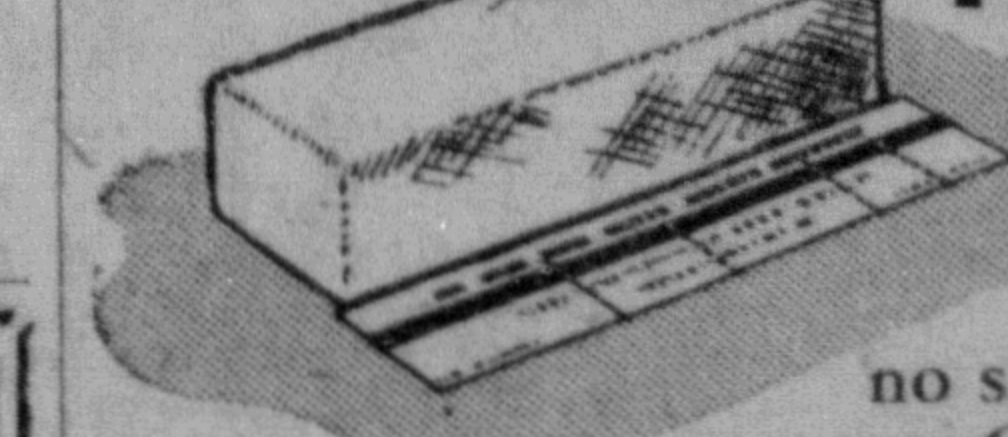
