BLACKWOOD on Bridge

Mr. Muzzy Puzzles For
By a Single Safety Play

One of the faults of Mr. Muzzy is his stubborn refusal to bid the full strength of his hand when that action is called for.

In today's deal, his second bid should have been three no trump instead of two. Mr. Champion could hardly be expected to make three bids on his near minimum holding and his pass of the two no trump call was justified. He made three-odd by a simple safety play. "Why put any strain on me, Muzzy?" he asked. "Why not go straight to game over my one no trump bid?" "Why, I bid every time!" replied Mr. Muzzy indignantly. "I bid diamonds, then I raised your no trump."

"What I'm trying to tell you," Mr. Champion interrupted, "is that as soon as I opened the bidding and you looked at your hand, you should have decided to bid game somewhere. When I bid one no trump on the second round, slam was out of the question."

"Also, it should have been clear to you that three no trump was our best spot for game. Why dilly-dally around with a two no trump bid? I can't bid your hand and mine, too." Mr. Champion was right. His opening promised one third of the deck in high cards. Mr. Muzzy also had a third. That added up to two thirds or about 65 per cent... which calls for a game bid unless the partnership hands are rank misfits. Nine tricks were easily accumulated by letting Mr. Meek hold the first heart trick with the jack. A heart was returned and Mr. Champion won with dummy's ace. He led a small diamond and the queen lost to Mr. Abel's king.

The heart return was won in the closed hand with the king and the nine of diamonds drove out Mr. Meek's ace. By reason of Mr. Champion's foresight at trick one, Mr. Meek had no heart to lead back at this point and the defenders had won their last trick.
