Tab, Taboo, TV Show, Vue, Wink The board is empowered to Zowie, Brief; impose the ban under terms of a Quebec act which describes as objectionable "any illustration which evokes real or fictitious scenes of crime or of the habitual life of criminals, or morbid or obscene situations or attitudes. tending to corrupt youth and pervert morals."

The board may repeal the ban if the publisher agrees to elim-"inate objectionable materia from his publications and gives proof that he is serious.

LONDON P-Bebe Daniels and Ben Lyon, once Hollywood topliners, have made what looks like a brilliant screen comeback at the age of 53.

British film critics have tossed all their superlatives into rave notices for "Life With the Lyons," an 81-minute shoestringbudget comedy based on their British radio show of the same

The radio series has been deighting 10 000.000 listeners a week, by official figures, since November, 1950.
