Lindberg Cited By Eisenhower

WASHINGTON (A) - President Eisenhower has proposed that the U.S. Air Force reserve commission of Charles A. Lindbergh be restored, and that the flier be promoted to brigadiergeneral.

In New York. Canadian-born Gen. George Kenney, Lindbergh's commander during a part of the Second World War in the Pacific, called the proposal "highly deserved, and a long time coming."

Lindbergh himself had nothing to say. The air force said he had not sought the appointment, but had been consulted about it and had agreed to accept it if tendered. Lindbergh resigned his com-

mission as a colonel in the army air corps reserve in 1941 after becoming "greatly disturbed" at implications by President Franklin D. Roosevelt "concerning my loyalty to my country.

Roosevelt was aroused by Lindbergh's 1940-41 speaking campaign against U.S. involvement in a European war, and by inference classed the aviator with American civil war "copperheads" men who felt the north could not win.

The films are being brought here by HMCS Chatham, where they also will be shown.




