> While in Siberia in 1903, Stalin received a note from Lenin-his first contact with the man who was to become Russia's leader and whom he was to succeed.

Trotzky made a bad guess in 1922 by refusing Lenin's suggestion that he become secretary of the Communist Party. The post went to Stalin, who saw in it the real power behind the fig- Evenings urative throne that Lenin had occupied. Lenin's post of chairman of the Communist Party was not filled after his death

the minor members of the party, off peasants-the kulaks-who opposed his collectivization drive eliminated as a class. It was estimated that more than 1,000,000 kulaks died of hunger after their grain had been confiscated.

Gregory Zinoviev and Leon Kameney, who had aided Stalin against Trotzky but had later gone over to Trotzky's side, were executed. Many others fell like wheat before the scythe during the purges of the 1930s or disappeared from sight. On December 1, 1934, Serge

Kirov, close friend of Stalin, had been slain in Leningrad. Executions for this killing passed the Kameney, tried with 17 codefendants, pleaded guilty to participation in the murder plot and were acntenced to prison Later, however, the case was

reopened. Zinoviev. Kamenev and 14 others were brought to part of a plot to wipe out all the leaders of the Soviet Union, with Stalin heading the list of intended victims.

They named Trotzky, then havened in Norway, as archconspirator. All 16 were executed. The Norwegian government. holding that Trotzky was a political refugee, refused to give

A number of onetime chief Bolshevist figures were among those executed in the purge trials. Many others were imprisoned.

The uniformity with which the defendants on trial confessed to the most sweeping crimes and plots against the government and old comrades caused wonder throughout the world.

Until Trotzky was removed from the Moscow scene by banishment, expediency dictated that no action be taken against
