## Blind Curlers Get Together On Sundays

WINNIPEG—Every Sunday night during the winter, a group of men and women participate in Winnipeg's smallest curling league and the only curling set-up of its kind in Canada.  
All 12 curlers on the three rinks are blind.  
About a year ago, a few members of the Manitoba League of the Blind decided to try their hand at the game as part of their winter recreation. They received permission to play at the Deer Lodge Club, and now the league has become one of the most popular sporting activities for the blind.  
Members of the Deer Lodge Club assist players in lining up shots. They also post the players on where the rocks are lying.  
One member, Stan MacDonald, has served as a helper for the league since its inception. He says he is "amazed" at the enthusiasm the players have for the game.  
"They've really turned in some surprising games at times," says MacDonald. "In two years of play I've only seen one blank end and in all that time there hasn't been one substitution on a rink."  
The helper's main function is to see that the curlers get lined up in a straight line with the house. The players must judge for themselves the proper weight for their shots.  
Two rinks see action each week, with the winning team and the idle one meeting the following Sunday.

### Mr. Muzzy Spots A Clue And Makes It Pay Off

Anybody but Mr. Muzzy would have known better than to double the six diamond bid. When Mr. Meek goes all the way to six by himself, he has really got a hand.

Of course Mr. Dafe would have gone back to six spades even without the double. But the point was that the double gave Mr. Meek a clue as to how to play for 12 tricks at spades. Do you see how he made his contract?

Mr. Muzzy opened the king of clubs and the lone ace won. Now, the "natural" play would be to cash the ace of spades, learn the bad news, then play the ace of diamonds and ruff a second diamond lead with dummy's king of spades.

A spade return, finessing the nine, would make it possible to pick up Mr. Champion's remaining trumps and spread the hand. But of course that would not work as Mr. Champion would ruff the first lead of diamonds and then, even if a subsequent lead of diamonds were ruffed with the king of spades, Mr.

Mr. Meek didn't go for the natural play. From the opening lead he deduced that Mr. Muzzy did not have the ace of hearts for the reason that he practically always opens an ace against a slam if he has one.

What did he have to make such a quick double of six diamonds? Could it be that he had all five outstanding diamonds? Mr. Meek thought it was quite likely.

After cashing the ace of spades and seeing Mr. Muzzy discard the 10 of hearts, he led THE TREY of diamonds.

Mr. Muzzy shook his head in confusion. Apparently Mr. Meek had pulled the wrong card. After carefully checking the dummy to make sure that only he, deuce was there, he won with the four of diamonds—the cheapest trick he ever won against a slam.

However, Mr. Meek had made the only winning play. He ruffed the club return, led another small diamond and ruffed with dummy's king of spades. A spade finesse was taken against Mr. Champion's 10 and the rest of the hand was all good.

## Luftwaffe Bases Re-Opened, Says Magazine Article

WASHINGTON (AP)—American Aviation magazine says Russia is building an East German air force and has reopened every former Luftwaffe air base.  
The trade publication said its reports from behind the Iron Curtain also indicate the Reds are building a system of air bases near the United States-owned Aleutian Island off Alaska and are starting to produce "in every category of combat aircraft, models comparable or superior to American and British types."

The magazine said Russia has built the "air section of the people's police" in East Germany into a tactical air army by training more than 300 German pilots in MIG-15s, the jet fighter now in action in Korea.

It said, too, that the Reds are reconvertng many former East German aircraft plants to plane production.

American Aviation said more than 1,000 Red combat planes are based in East Germany in addition to several hundred jet fighters on the Polish side of the German border.

Walter Choopka, 50-year-old city hotel employee discovered badly injured in his home here, Jan. 20, has been transferred to a Vancouver hospital.

His physician said the man was totally blind but had regained consciousness several days before his transfer. One of his eyes has been removed.
