Blood Donor Experiment May End Plasma Famine;

shortage of life-giving plasma. The guards have been donating their blood every two weeks during the experiment, about five times the frequency approved for the average donor by the American Red Cross.

In the unusual part of the experiment, the blood is broken down into plasma and red corpuscles and the red blood cells are immediately returned to the donors' system by the apparatus, known as the Cohn blood fractlonator.




