The campaign starter September 7 and continues until the end of the month. Among today's money-saving agencies The Salvation Army must hold a foremost place. It's economical use of public funds, as demonstrated by the fact that this year's quota of \$3,500 is the same as last year and the year before, should alone warrant this admission.

No one, however, can measure the saving to a nation when a derelict is steered back into channels of usefulness. Consider any country's bill of expense for maintenance of penal institutions, a bill that runs annually into millions. Think of the similar sum that is spent so that the machinery of law might operate smoothly and efficiently. Yet little of these vast amounts ever find their way back into the national exchequer.

In its work The Salvation Army often accepts responsibility for keeping a man out of prison and seeing that "he goes straight." The Army also undertakes to rehabilitate that man who has servhis time. 'He is thus saved from becoming a financial liability (not to mention any other kind of liability) to the community by spending more time in institutions at the taxpayer's expense.

There is no doubt that but for the humansalvage operations of movements like The Salvation Army, the country's finances would be increasingly burdened. Taxes might even be higher than they are!
