

## PC Raps Stand Of Government On Dam Issue

Ottawa (CP) — A Progressive Conservative Commons member from British Columbia accused the federal government Wednesday of trying to club the B.C. government over the issue of Columbia river water power.

Howard Green, Vancouver Quadra, said the two governments will have to co-operate for development of the huge power potential of the river.

Mr. Green, speaking in the throne speech debate, expressed doubts as to a government bill introduced into the Commons Monday to require a federal licence for construction of works that would change the flow of an international river such as the Columbia.

One aim of the measure is to block an agreement between the B.C. government and the Kaiser aluminum interests of the United States for damming the river in Canada to provide more power for Kaiser South of Canada-U.S. border.

Mr. Green noted the speech from the throne said an objective of the measure is to see that resources are used in the best interests of the Canadian public. His party approved anything that meant the use of Canadian resources by the Canadian people first.

"But," he added, "I believe this proposal is designed as a club to beat the government of B.C."

"Nonsense!" interjected Health Minister Martin.

Mr. Green said the two governments, through statements issued by ministers, have been calling each other names. B.C. was ready to go to the courts on the issue, while the federal government was "prepared to beat it into submission."

The power resources of the Columbia river can only be developed by co-operation," he added. "There must be co-operation between the two governments."

Dealing with unemployment in B.C. Mr. Green said the federal government has been evading responsibility in refusing to share the cost of caring for unemployed in that province, many of whom came from other parts of Canada.

It was, he said, a complete about-face from its stand at the federal-provincial conference of 1945.
