Submissions should reach the editor by December 1, 1955. They should contain the author's name, grade school, town and province. Any student from Grade VIII to Grade XIII is eligible. Submissions will be selected according to their liveliness and originality.

Acknowledgments of receipt and return of submissions will be, unfortunately, impossible. Publication date has been tentatively for June, 1956.

Provincial Departments of Education have expressed interest in this project. Principals will be reminded to pass on this information to staff and students.

## Saturday Sermon

**SALVATION IN JESUS A "MUST"**  
Neither is there salvation in any other; for there is no other name under heaven given amongst men whereby we should be saved.

In this verse that I would like to bring to your attention in the last three words of our text — "Must be" — the reason that God has provided for us in His son Jesus Christ is a "must."

Some men and women believe that if Christ died for all, then we are all saved regardless of how we serve Him here on earth. It certainly is true to Scripture that Christ died for all and that He is no respecter of persons, but Scripture also teaches that all men and women are born under the condemnation of sin and death, Romans 6:23 — "For the wages of sin is death" — as a result of this we "need to be saved."

John 1:12 — "But as many as received Him to them gave He the power to become the sons of God even to those who believe on His name." God has provided salvation for us by sending His Son to pay for our sin on Calvary's cross... but we must personally reach out by faith and accept it, Romans 9:10 — "For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation."

Let each one of us ask ourselves the question "Have I personally accepted Christ as my Saviour, and if not, why haven't I?"

Genesis 6:3 says "My Spirit shall not always strive with man." So if His Spirit is speaking to you, and since by His Word you know that you need salvation — then why not decide today?

"Hark! Come on the wind is the bell," solemn toll: "Thy mournfully pealing the knell of a soul — The Spirit's sweet leading and strivings are o'er: The Lord of the vineyard stand waiting no more."
