"DRAWING BACK FROM GOD"

"For if we sin wilfully after that we have received the knowledge of the truth, there remaineth no more sacrifice for sins." In this verse of Scripture the Apostle seems to refer to the law found in Numbers 15: 30, 31. God called them presumptuous sinners (bold or overconfident) God says they will be cut off.
