The most deadly of all overcalls is the one which uses up a maximum of bidding space. An overcall of one heart over a onediamond opening uses up no bidding space at all. Third hand can conveniently bid one spade or two clubs or whatever he planned to bid. And, if he had planned to respond with one heart, he can merely double.




