

With only nine parents of the nearly 150 whose boys play in the Prince Rupert Little League Baseball association turning up to the annual meeting last night at the Civic Centre, league officials postponed the election of officers until next Thursday, November 3.

In an effort to drag parents away from their other activities and get them out to the meeting to elect a strong execulive for next year, members of last night's meeting will meet tonight to mimeograph letters to 150 parents urging them to attend the next meeting. The letter will point out that their boys have been in Little League from anywhere from one to three years and that support of the parents is needed so that Little League will be continued next year.

One of the major items to be decided next Thursday, President J. S. Foster said, would be the choosing of a new president. Little League constitution lays down that a new man should be elected.
