

## Potpourri To Feature Exhibit of CNIB Work

Outstanding examples of craft work from the Vancouver Branch of the Canadian Institute for the Blind have arrived in Prince Rupert for presentation at the Civic Centre's Second Annual Potpourri, which starts tomorrow and continues until Thursday.

The CNIB exhibit will be one of the features of the three-day show which will fill both the Civic Centre gymnasium and auditorium.

Among articles in the CNIB collection are cracker trays, dog baskets, fern stands, bassinets and shopping baskets.

Also here and ready for setting up is a display of pottery from the Vancouver School of Art.

The Potpourri will feature a large display of crafts carried out by Civic Centre members during the year. This will include individual stalls of pottery, flowercraft, copper work, leatherwork and woodwork.

Besides the craft exhibits there will be a varied program going on all three days.

Films on pottery, weaving, metal work, puppetry, model house-building and paper sculpture will be shown by the Prince Rupert film Council on Tuesday and Thursday evening.

There will be homecooking stalls operated by the Catholic Women's League and The Salvation Army on Tuesday afternoon and evening; Sonja Ladies and St. Andrew's cathedral Junior Auxiliary on Wednesday and the Lutheran Church WA on Thursday.

The Imperial Order of the Daughters of the Empire will operate the tea room on all three days and the Prince Rupert gyro club will be in charge of a fishpond for the youngsters on Thursday.

The Order of the Royal Purple will be staging a Chinese Laundry tomorrow, Wednesday and Thursday nights and the Women of the Moose will be running a candy stall both afternoon and evenings on all three days.

A variety stall is scheduled for Wednesday afternoon and evening with the Prince Rupert General Hospital Auxiliary in charge.

On Thursday evening the students council of Booth Memorial high school will operate a candy stall.

The Presbyterian Church Women's Auxiliary will hold a sale of needlecraft on Thursday afternoon and evening.

Rowley Miles, craft director of the Civic Centre, said today that preparations have also been made for an exhibit from the patients at Miller Bay Hospital and that it promises to be as colorful as last year's.

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## RCAF Personnel Coming To Complete Band Fixtures

Two RCAF officers are due in town Wednesday to complete arrangements for the performances of the Air Force band of Edmonton which will play at a concert in the Civic Centre Friday night and at the Tri-Services Ball at the HMCS Chatham Saturday night.

The two are Flight Lt. Leo Corcoran, Edmonton, director of the band, and Flight Lt. Hal Carting, Vancouver, liaison officer for air cadets in B.C.

During their three-day visit in Prince Rupert the 40 members of the band, rated one of the finest in Canada, will be housed in the Armory. All belong to the RCAF and were selected for their musical ability. The full band will play at the concert, while for the dance a 12-piece orchestra will be made up from the group. The band has a full repertoire of classical, popular, novelty and military numbers.

Soon after its appearance here the band is scheduled to make a six-week tour of Europe.

Proceeds from the concert will be used to assist the local air cadet squadron which at present is establishing its own separate headquarters. Proceeds from the dance, which is sponsored by the three services, will be divided between the Air Cadets and the band.

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
