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

# BLACKWOOD on BRIDGE

World Championship Play Illustrates Bidding Theory

The textbooks do not tell the whole story about opening bids. Open with twelve points, they say, if you have a good rebiddable suit.

Here is the rest of the story. If you have a strictly minor suit hand, you need more. A "minor suit hand" can be defined as follows: It is a hand with less than thirteen points in high cards. It has four cards or less in the major suits. It does not have decent support for either major suit.

To open a hand of this sort just because it has 12 points and a rebiddable suit is a losing proposition more often than not. If partner has a good hand (say about the equal of an opening bid) there is a good chance that you will get too high. The reason is that partner will immediately start thinking about game and if the hand must be played in a minor suit, 11 tricks may be overboard.

**NEW OBJECTIVE**

If you had a hand suitable for major-suit or no-trump play and partner had the same hand described above, again he would press to reach game. But here the objective would be nine or ten tricks.

Another situation which often develops after an opening bid on a weakish minor-suit hand is the one where partner bids three no-trump during the course of the auction. You don't know whether to stay there or not. If you do, possibly you are down several tricks at a hopeless contract. If you decide to take out four of your minor, partner will often gamble on five-odd and go set there.

Today's deal is taken from the 1953 World Championship match between the American and Swedish teams. Mr. Lilliehook, who held the South cards, might have had an opening bid at match-point play, but at total points or at rubber bridge I would strongly recommend a pass in spite of his "12 points and a good rebiddable suit."

**SAND THROWER**

The Swedish player in the North seat tried to throw sand in the eyes of his opponents with his three diamond bid, but it gained nothing. Raape opened a diamond against the club slam and the declarer lost a diamond

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## Form Book Out This Year For U.K. Soccer Forecast

LONDON — Last year's form book hasn't been much use in the English Football League's first division, this season so far at least.

With one-third of the program completed, evidence is plentiful that some of the old favorites are not as good as they once were. Take Liverpool, leading alone in front of the 24-team pack in contrast to last year. Both had goal and a winner's head to get that last.

**IN BLACKPOOLS' PLACE**

Chelsea, the London defending game champions, are 10th, as when Blackpool were 10th.

That top Athletic, the in-fact, leading team from the west, is 11th. They are in second place while Arsenal, and

Tottenham Hotspur are keeping Chelsea company.

West Bromwich Albion in third place is another different team, so far. Only Cardiff City is displaying any consistency by sticking in 20th place, close to its favorite position all last year.

"It's just the way football goes," said Stanley Matthews, Blackpool's slightly younger brother of 40 who is having a good season at outside right. "If you get the breaks you're a winning team."

Centre-forward Roy Bentley of Leeds, a Chelsea adversary, who with Matthews has been a consistent England player, has just one goal in 10 matches so far this year.

Yet he scored 22 in leading the Panthers to their first league triumph last year, and 21 the previous season. Last summer, he scored all England's points against France, Spain and Portugal.

Classic example of a team running wild in the right direction was Everton, which dropped into the second division in 1950. With just about the same complement of players, it bounced back the next year and went on to take the league championship and the Football Association Cup the next two years.

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
