70-Game Warmup Set Tonight For Wings-Canadiens Finals

IN THE Canadian Press Bi-monthly hockey starts another 70-game grind tonight, and it's the same old story... who can stop Detroit Red Wings and Montreal Canadiens?

By the time next spring rolls around, the experts figure it will be Detroit and Montreal sitting atop the National Hockey League. The wings pick which one will be in first place.

The revamped but apparently no-stronger-over Red Wings start their off home against Chicago Black Hawks while at Montreal, Toronto Maple Leafs give their fans goals and glamour theory their best test.

New York Rangers open their season on the road Friday night in Chicago and Boston Bruins start their season in Montreal Saturday night.

Since last season no less than 15 players exchanged swatters and at least another 20 rookies have entered the league.

Detroit underwent the most drastic changes as general manager Jack Adams thought it was about time his champions took on a new look. As a result, only nine of last season's players are back.

But if last Sunday's all-star game gave any indication the Wings are no weaker than they were last spring when they captured their seventh straight NHL title and the Stanley Cup for the second year in a row, Detroit beat the all-stars 3-1.

Caught in Adams' trade winds was centerline Terry Sawchuk, current holder of the Vezina trophy. But, as is usually the case

Top Flight Season Forecast
For Wings' New Defenceman

SAULT STE. MARIE, Mich. 4
—If the words of Jack Adams, Jimmy Skinner and Sugar Jim Henry mean anything, Toronto Warren Godfrey is in for a big year in his first season as a big star.

Godfrey, recently acquired from Boston Bruins in an off-season trade, ranks high in the books of Adams, Detroit general manager. "Warren could be one of the greatest defencemen in the National Hockey League," Adams said in an interview.

He has fitted nicely into the Red Wing style of play working alongside Red Kelly, and he should improve considerably.

The youngster has always been an outstanding hockey player."

COULD BE ALL-STAR

Coach Jimmy Skinner goes even higher in his praise for the 24-year-old defenceman. "God-

frey could be an all-star defenceman this year. He definitely was one of the top performers the Bruins had last season and there is no reason why he shouldn't be equally effective with our club."

"He's fast, and rugged and he skates and carries the puck well. All he needs is to be happy, and I'm sure he'll be happy with us this time."

In his three years at Boston, Godfrey earned the reputation for being a puck carrier in his own right. Star Jim Henry, who played in goal behind Godfrey over that stretch, says "the kid is a lot of hockey player."

"He carries the puck nicely and he doesn't mind using his weight to good advantage."

Godfrey was discovered by Ranger general manager Muzz Patrick in 1951 while he was with Tacoma Rockets of the Western League. However, when Muzz sought him he discovered that brother Lynn had arrived first and Godfrey moved up to the Bruins at the start of the 1952 season.
