

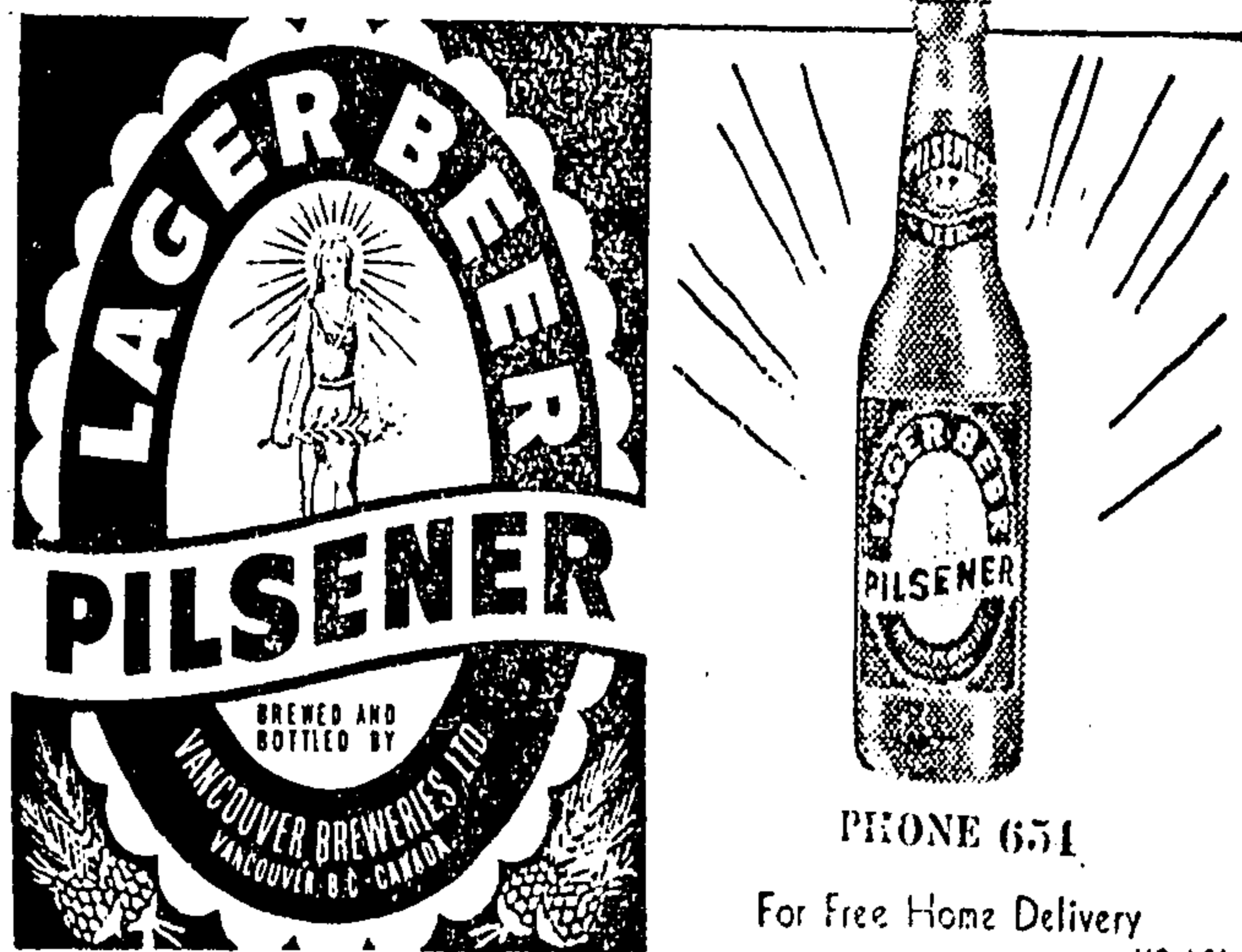

**Kelleher Hero
As Stars Rally
To Trim Seattle**

Big Frank Kelleher doesn't get into the Hollywood lineup often this season, but when he does he never seems to show the effects of bench sitting. He still has a keen eye for a curving baseball, and he proved it once again Thursday night as the Stars beat Seattle 8-4 in a Pacific Coast League baseball game.

Seattle was leading the Stars 2-1 in the seventh. Dale Long was on third and Tommy Saffell on second. Manager Bob Bragan, who was scheduled to bat, motioned to Kelleher. Frank swung two bats around for a full minute, stepped into the box, worked the count to 3 and 2, and then socked the next pitch over the left field wall.

The Hollywood victory kept the Stars in first place in the standing, and San Diego remained a half game behind in shading San Francisco 2-0.

Portland manhandled Oakland's classy left-hander, Arlie Schallack, and beat the Acorns 12-1. Red Adams gave Charley Dressen's club only seven hits.

Schallack gave way in the third inning but Portland continued its attack with a five-run fifth inning.

Tail-end Los Angeles finally broke its nine-game losing streak. The Angels whipped Sacramento 8-4 behind Bubba Church's pitching.

Seattle pitcher Gene Bearden was spiked in the leg in the first inning of the game at Hollywood and several stitches had to be taken to close the wound. Bearden covered home on a steal as Hollywood outfielder Carlos Bernier streaked for a home run with one on.

At Stampede**

CALGARY (CP)—The Stampede continues to pack in record-breaking crowds.

The third consecutive attendance record was set Thursday when 66,542 persons got their share of cowboys and Indians, despite a bit of rain, the first of the week.

The crowd was an increase of 2,81 over the previous high Thursday last year, total attendance for the first four days stands at 288,200, against 272,533 in the same period last year.

Down in the chute, Bill Ward of Angel's Camp Cal., remained the favorite in the featured North American bronc riding championship. But an unknown Canadian cowboy, George Myron of Viking, All gave him a tough competition in the second go-round.

Harry Tompkins of Dublin, Tex., and Gordon Earle of Newgate, B.C. share first place in the bareback horse second go-round Thursday.

Lel Haverly of Benson, Ariz., won first money in calf roping while Alfred Owen of Patricia, Alta., took the novice riding go-round.

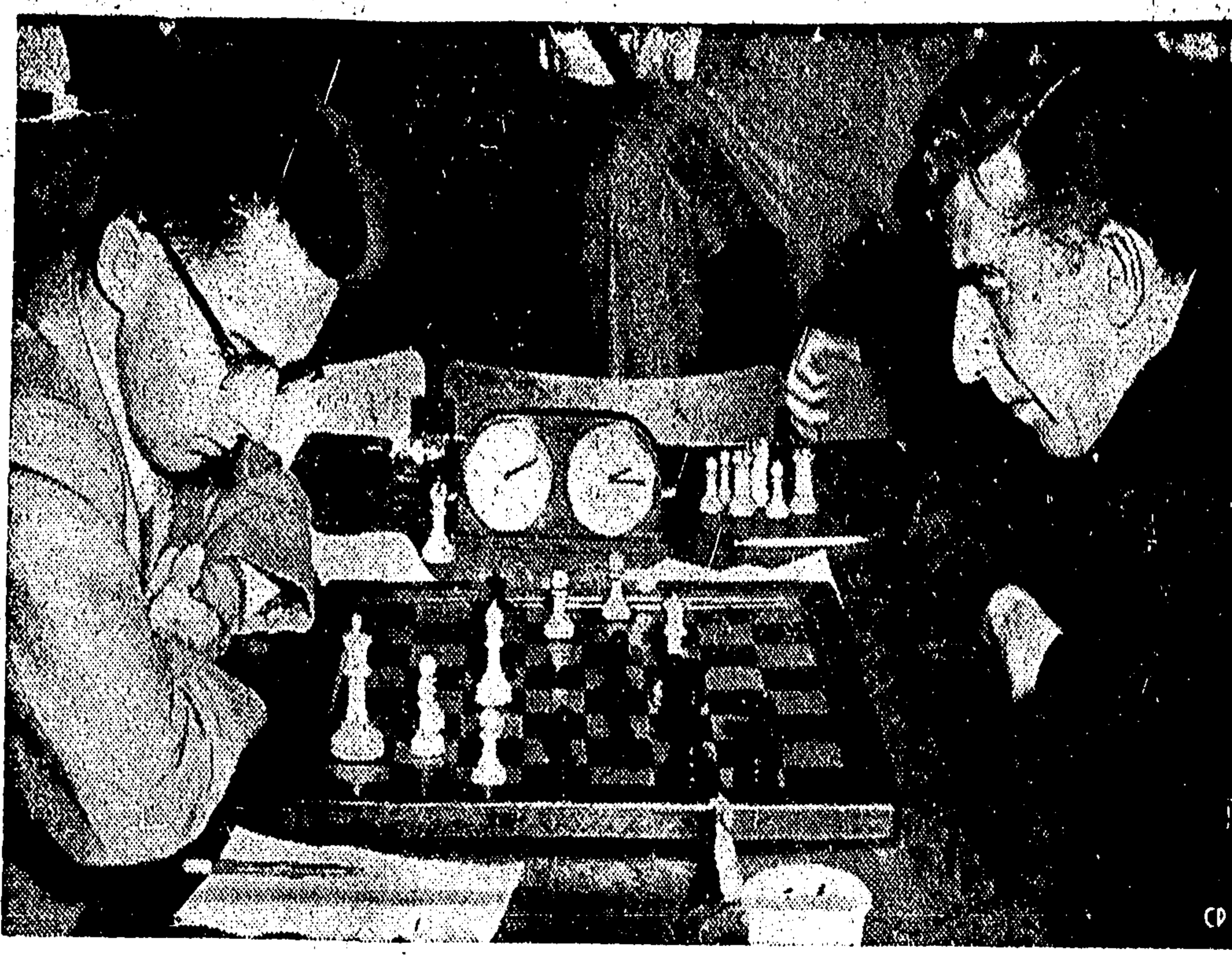
John McKay of Black Diamond, Alta., led steer decorators in the new go-round.

Timely Advice—Play Card You Are Known to Hold

As illustrated in recent columns, there are many benefits to be derived from following that excellent advice, "Play a card you are known to hold, or which you will be known to hold after the next trick."

Today's hand is another example of the use of this play. The queen of hearts was the opening lead and as you see Mr. Abel could have taken nine tricks any time he pleased. But of course he didn't know that. And Mr. Dale made a play that kept him from finding out.

Mr. Abel won the first trick with the ace of hearts. He had two winners in spades, two in hearts and one in clubs, owing to the fortunate fact that Mr. Dale held the queen-ten of diamonds alone, four tricks were readily available in that suit.

LEADS DEUCE

Mr. Abel couldn't possibly have gone wrong if he had laid down the ace of diamonds first. But for some reason he chose to lead the deuce of diamonds at trick two—and that gave Mr. Dale his opportunity to make a deceptive play. He promptly followed suit with the queen.

Actually he had nothing to lose by this play and plenty to gain. If he played his ten, the jack would undoubtedly be finessed (successfully), and the rest of the suit would then set up automatically.

But on the play of the queen, Mr. Abel was led to believe Mrs. Keen had started with five diamonds to the ten. If that were the case, he could still bring in four tricks in the suit.

DALE WINS

So, after winning with the king he returned the five and confidently finessed the nine spot. He was considerably shaken when Mr. Dale won with the ten.

The jack of hearts was returned and dummy's king won. The only chance now was a finesse of the jack of spades. When that lost, Mr. Dale was able to cash enough heart tricks to defeat the "ice-cold" contract.

**Meat Prices
In Britain
Leveling Off**

LONDON (Reuters)—The price of meat edged down to normal here today after skyrocketing earlier this week with the ending of 14 years of rationing.

Prices rose to double and triple when the first "free" meat went on the market Monday. But buyers' resistance from the housewives has since brought levels steadily downwards.

Prices today hovered around 20 per cent above ration levels and butchers forecast they would be down to last week's figures by the week-end.

**Mendes-France,
Molotov Plan
To Meet Again**

PARIS (CP)—Premier Pierre Mendes-France will meet with Soviet foreign minister V. M. Molotov in Geneva Sunday in a resumption of high-level talks aimed at ending the war in Indo-China.

This was announced today by the French foreign office, which said Mendes-France will leave Paris by plane Saturday night for Geneva. Mendes-France has promised to resign if he has not worked out an Indo-China ceasefire by July 20.

Mendes-France met with Red China's premier Chou En-lai at Bern, Switzerland, June 23. Since then Chou has returned home and held a meeting with Ho Chi Minh, Communist leader of the Vietnam in Indo-China. Chou is due back in Geneva late Monday.

**Arms Shipped
To Guatemala
Said Useless**

NEW YORK (CP)—The New York Times said in a dispatch from Mexico City today that one of the arms the Iron Curtain countries recently shipped to the ousted Arbenz government were useless. Some were duds, worn out or entirely unsuitable for warfare in Guatemala, the paper quoted Guatemalan army officers as saying.

This was one reason the army failed to put up an effective fight against Castillo's rebels, it was said. The Times report continued:

The arms, for which the Guatemalans are reported to have paid \$5,000,000 to \$10,000,000 were mostly Second World War weapons the Russians captured from the Germans. Much of the shipment was anti-tank mines, and the rebels used no tanks. Several German cannons, designed for wide highways, were useless on Guatemala's mile trails.

When fighting started, the army had to divert troops and trucks to transport the arms from an arsenal in the heart of Guatemala City to the outskirts of town. It was feared a bomb from the rebels' four-plane air force would hit the arsenal and wreck the city.
