The same day and the following one, actress Grace Kelly, in civil and religious ceremonies, will be married to Prince Rainier III of Monaco. Prior to both these major news items, on Tuesday, April 17, the baseball season will be officially opened in the United States. Repercussions could follow two, if not all three, of the events.

One cannot tell from one day to the next how Bulganin and Khrushchev are going to act. Britain is just recovering from Russia's best piece of supersalesmanship in the chubby form of Georgi Malenkov. Apart from his part-time forced smile and handshaking, he was living proof that demotion in the Kremlin doesn't necessarily mean liquidation under the new "collective leadership" deal. The Rover boys Nikolai and Nikita are, however, a different brew of Bolsheviks. Their ranting and raving against the West while they toured the Far East is still fresh in most memories. Whether they will follow up Ma!enkov's good-will tactics with a show of friendship or whether they'll take the opportunity to sound off with new criticism of Western policies, remains to be seen. 




