Closer To Airport

IN ALLOCATING \$1,000,000 to the improvement of air facilities in north-central B.C., the federal government has taken one step closer to the point where it can no longer overlook the need for an airport here. Unless the gap in air services at this end in closed, the value of the projects at Terrace, Smithers and Prince George will be substantially reduced and the expenditure of \$1,000,000 will be a much less sound investment than it should be.

It is a little disturbing, however, that so far there has been no intimation that Ottawa is giving any thought to Prince Rupert in this connection. Since the visit of our two airport delegates to the capital in February, the silence there on the matter has been as profound as ever. While it is true there probably will be no official indication of what the government proposes to do — if anything — until the supplementary estimates are brought down, undertakings of this sort are often preceded by some hint of what is going on.

Although cos s are much lower than previously estimated, it is still too large a job to be kept in complete secrecy. One might expect, for example, that there would be another on-the-spot survey to determine the best route for a road, consider docking facilities and other such necessary details. As far as is known, no work of this nature has been carried out, yet it would have to be a first step in getting the project underway.

However, all this may be a pessimistic view of the situation. The fact is that the two airport delegates definitely gained the impression that the government had moved past the stage of debating whether the project was worthwhile and was more interested in ascertaining how it could be accomplished. Since its determination to develop flying along the northern line of B.C. has now been confirmed, it must follow as a virtual certainty that Prince Rupers will be included in its plans. Not only is this the largest city in northern B.C. but it has a location which puts it in direct line with main air routes north and south, east and west.

Sooner or later our long wait for an airport is bound to end.

In Short Supply

D USINESS executives in the United States are having difficulty in finding secretaries. Oddly chough, the low birth-rate of the 1930's is blamed for the lack of supply. The women's bureau of the Labor Department states: "In 1950, there were about 19,000 fewer young women 20 to 24 years of age than there were in 1940, and approximately one million fewer girls 14 to 19 years of age. This means the supply of young women workers will continue to decrease in the near future."

And if that were not enough to explain the current situation, it is to be noticed that the high marrjage and birth-rate of recent years has further cut into the supply of women who want office work.



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


