Good Word For Canada

CINCE there is a tendency among Canadians to underrate their achievements, they are surprised every now and then when someone else speaks up for them.

This happened at the recent Associated Boards of Trade convention in Ketchikan. It is not quite accurate to say that the B.C. delegates there were completely overwhelmed by the nice things that Alexander Baird, general manager of the Alaska Development Board, had to say about Canada, but they were human enough to feel a pretty warm glow.

It was Mr. Baird's contention that Canada can give the U.S. a lesson in the development of natural resources. Pointing to the geological similarity of Alaska and northwest Canada, he asked why it was that Canadians have done so much with mining in their territory and the Alaskans have done practically nothing.

The answer, he said, lay in the more intelligent Canadian tax management to encourage new mines and in the assistance given to prospectors.

In connection with the latter, he said: "Contrary to the very fruitful Canadian policy of financing, guiding and supervising prospectors, we Alaskans have no such organization. It is easier to go salmon fishing than to venture into hardly accessible hills in which a man is deprived of all comfort and security, in which his very physical survival is of no concern to anyone."

Turning to the production of oil, he compared the spectacular development in northwest Canada to the Alaskan ventures which he described as "so little and so late." Here he believed one of the troubles was the U.S. policy of closing off large areas of geologically favorable land for government and military purposes. Of 60 million acres in Alaska classified as favorable, 43 to 47 million have heen affected by land reserving orders.

"It is a matter which has already become somewhat of a tradition unworthy of a free economy,"

"The main purpose of drawing this parallel between the Canadian northwest and Alaskan mining, oil and gas developments is not merely to congratuwish them continued success," he said. "Our purpose was to pinpoint those obstacles in the Territory of Alaska which must be eliminated to open the way to development on a scale similar to that across the border."

. Mr. Baird's wishes for our success are reciprocated. It is to our mutual benefit if both sides of the border flourish, for our interests are too closely bound together in this northwest corner of the continent to permit any one part to try to go it alone.




