LIGHT CRUISER HMCS ONTARIO, shown above steaming northward, will arrive in Prince Rupert Friday for a three day visit. The 8,700-ton vessel is commanded by Capt. Robert Philip Welland, DSC and Bar, CD, RCN, is on an extensive training cruise throughout northern British Columbia waters and later California waters. She was built in Belfast, Ireland, and commissioned under the command of Capt. H. T. W. Grant, CBE, DC, RCN, later Vice-Admiral Grant, chief of naval staff. One: of the most widely-travelled ships in the Royal Canadian Navy,

the Ontario was commissioned too late to take an active part in the Second World War. Arriving in Sydney, Australia on VJ Day, Ontario proceeded to Hong Kong where she was engaged on policing duties for a period. The 555½ foot Ontario returned to Canada in November, 1945. After extensive resit, she was re-commissioned in July, 1947. The Ontario has been employed since then on training duties. In 1955 carried out two training with British and French officers. 
