

Braves Grab NL Lead

Chalk Up 5th Win For New Manager

What is it with Fred Haney? He takes over from Charlie Grimm, who resigned as Milwaukee manager under fire after losing 12 of 17 to tumble from first to fifth, and four days later Braves are leading the National League again.

Braves have not lost since Haney, who never finished better than last in three other stints as a National League skipper, reluctantly took over in Brooklyn last Saturday night. They made it five in a row Wednesday night, completing a sweep of three from the plunging Pittsburgh Pirates, 7-3, to move back into the top spot in last-place Philadelphia. Jumbo Clement's hold on the lead 3-2. That caused yet another re-

vision in the hectic National League standings, giving Milwaukee a 13-point edge over Brooklyn Dodgers, who snapped a three-game losing streak with a 4-2 decision over St. Louis Cardinals. The Cards hold fourth, two points back of Redlegs, who in turn are two points behind the Braves.

Pirates, with five straight defeats, are fifth, but still very much in contention only one game behind Braves.

New York Giants reclaimed sixth place from Chicago, beating Cubs 4-1.

In the American League, New York Yankees made it seven in a row as Mickey Mantle jolted his 28th and 27th home runs in a 4-1 verdict over Detroit Tigers. Chicago White Sox held second, 5 1/2 games behind, with a 12-8 decision over Baltimore. Cleveland ended a third-place tie with Boston by topping Red Sox 5-4 in 10 innings. Washington came from behind to beat Kansas City 5-4.

THREE-GAME SERIES JULY 1-2 WITH KETCHIKAN CONFIRMED

Final confirmation that Ketchikan will play a two-day series here over the July 1 weekend with the All-Stars of the Prince Rupert Senior Baseball league was received by Art Murray city baseball commissioner yesterday.

Mr. Murray said the Alaska team will play two games at Roosevelt park Sunday, July 1 and a single fixture Monday, July 2.

The local all-stars will travel to Ketchikan for the return series July 4, playing a double-header that day and returning to Prince Rupert the same night.

The all-star team will be chosen following establishment of standings of teams after Sunday, June 24 games, Mr. Murray said.

The baseball commissioner said he was hoping that local spectators would be enthusiastic enough to make the trip to Ketchikan to root for the Prince Rupert squad.

Shorter Course This Year For Yacht Club Log Race

A shorter predicted log-race will be run off this year at the Prince Rupert Yacht Club's annual regatta next Sunday, with boats covering a distance of about 13.5 miles instead of the 28 miles covered last year, Jim Cumming of the log-race committee said this morning.

The entrants will leave from the Yacht Club and travel to Tuck Inlet and finish in front of the Canadian National Steamship wharf at 2:30 p.m.

Contestants will be penalized for late starts and for all variations from predicted time in completing the course.

Outboard enthusiasts have been spending the last few evenings in increased pre-race activities, practicing cornering, tuning up motors and preparing hulls for the races, Henry Seppa, regatta chairman said today.

To date 30 entrants have been received for the various race categories. An extra race, a novelty slow-boat race sponsored by the Prince Rupert Fishermen's Co-Operative Association, will be held this year, Mr. Seppa said.

Slowest boat to finish without having the motor stop is the winner.

In addition to contestants, Mr. Seppa said that outboard motor dealers have expressed interest in the race and will attempt to have demonstrator models entered.
