## LANDSLIDE IN CALIFORNIA INJURES IWO PICKNICKERS

SANTA MONICA, Calif. M—One of the landslides that plague the Pacific Pallsades suddenly broke loose yesterday. tumbling four picnicking women down from a 175-foot-high bluff and dumping tons of earth on the Coast Highway." Two of the women suffered broken backs.

One car was caught in the onrush of dirt, but its two occupants escaped. They said the avalanche "sounded like a waterfall."

Marcel Gentillon, Santa Monica assistant director of public works, estimated 15,000 to 20,000 tons of rocks and dirt gave way. The Coast Highway, which parallels the ocean, was covered for about 150 feet with dirt 155 feet deep. The Palisades, with lawn and trees forming a ribbon of park along the top of the bluff, offer a picturesque view of


the ocean and beach below. There have been three other landslides since last Dec. 1.


