# 8th Try Ends in Failure

## Strait Foils Chef 4½ Miles Off Goal

VICTORIA (P)—A husky Victoria chef battled the tides and currents of Juan de Fuca Strait for 12 hours and 35 minutes Thursday and ended up only about seven miles out from here in a vain attempt to swim 18.3 miles to Port Angeles, Wash.

The 270-pound swimmer, Ben Laughren, at one point was within 4½ miles of his destination. He was forced to give up after rip tides and 20-mile-an-hour winds carried him nearly seven miles backward from his goal.

Laughren, so far unsuccessful in the crossing, said he will make a ninth attempt to swim the strait.

Two other swimmers—Bill Muir of Saanich, B.C., and Miss Billie Benedict of Vancouver—made unsuccessful attempts to swim the once-beaten strait Wednesday.

Bert Thomas of Tacoma, Wash., became the only person

to swim the strait last year. His time was 11 hours 17 minutes.

Marilyn Bell, the 18-year-old Toronto swimmer, has been training daily under coach Gus Ryder for an attempt on Juan de Fuca scheduled within five weeks.

## Mexican, U.S. Scullers Score Upsets

PORT DALHOUSIE, Ont. (CP)—Spectators at the Royal Canadian Henley regatta Thursday watched two important events fall to unseeded scullers, one to a 26-year-old Mexican who had never rowed outside his home before, the other to an unknown high school eight from Buffalo, N.Y.

Deserting their traditional favorites, the crowd cheered Roberto Retolaza of Mexico City's Club Espana to victory in the final of the junior singles.

The Mexican sculler rowed to victory over Art McKinlay of Detroit Boat Club with a winning time of 8:27.4.


Today Retolaza moves up a couple of notches from junior competition to senior. He is entered in the senior 155-pound singles where he is scheduled to meet such rated scullers as Tom Smith of Hamilton Leanders and Bill Hoover of Detroit Boat Club.

## Jags Shine In Car Test Of Endurance

LE MANS, France (AP)—Powerful British D-type Jaguars, which swept top spots in the Rheims 12-hour race, made a repeat performance Thursday night in making the best trials times for Saturday's 24-hour Grand Prix of endurance for sports cars.

Mike Hawthorn established an unofficial track record of 188.632 kilometers, 117 miles an hour, over the course which has been modified since last year and now is 13,461 kilometers (8.36 miles) around.

The course has been slightly shortened and many safety factors added since last year's disaster which took 90 lives in the worst crash in auto racing history.

Thursday night's trials completed a field of 49 cars which will start the race.
