

# Inoculations Given To Curb Outbreak Of Infectious Jaundice at Terrace Board Told

An epidemic of infectious hepatitis has been reported in the Terrace district. Dr. John Smith, director of the Skeena Health Unit, told the Unic Board of Health quarterly meeting.

Hepatitis or jaundice, is a disease often found in boom-town where poor sanitary conditions and poor personal hygiene exist.

It can be caught from any intimate object, he said.

In an attempt to curb the

jaundice outbreak all intimate contacts as far as possible, have been given inoculations of gamma globulin which will give protection up to two months.

A test taken of the Terrace water supply, showed that although the system was not satisfactory, there was no definite evidence that the water was the cause of the contagious epidemic.

The commissioners of the village have been advised of the water test results, Dr. Smith said.

The TB Coast Travelling Clinic at the Skeena Health Unit area was most successful in all areas except in Hazelton where attendance was poor.

A number of new cases and also some old cases which had relapsed, were discovered, the board was told. The visit of the Children's Travelling Clinic to Prince Rupert was also a great success.

The question of the federal assisted low rental home project to help overcome the housing shortage was brought up at the meeting by Board members but discussion was withheld until further information was obtained from the Minister of Municipal Affairs.

The Health Board commended Prince Rupert General Hospital for the co-operation in the emergency following the discovery of a paratyphoid case in the hospital.
