Let's Have More Immigrants

A LTHOUGH the population of Canada has just passed the 15 million mark, our rate of immigration will have to be stepped up greatly if the country is to keep pace with its opportunities.

This is the forward-looking view of the Canadian Chamber of Commerce on the basis of a report just released by its immigration committee. It is the Chamber's contention that to carry out an adequate program of development, Canada must double its population by 1975. At the present rate, however, the increase in population by that time will be less than four million.

"The need for greater population is based on primary requisites, such as defence, production and economic well-being," the Chamber remarks. "These requirements alone strongly indicate the need for an aggressive immigration policy."

But by no stretch of imagination does the present policy meet that description. Canada is now admitting fewer immigrants each year than it was before the first World War. In 1913 the figure was almost 500,000. In 1953 it was less than 170,000. In fact, it would appear that the country is laboring under the belief that the depression of the 1930's is still with us, for the immigration rate dropped sharply then and has never fully recovered.

The old bugaboo that immigrants cause a scarcity of jobs has no basis in fact. It is estimated that of every 100 newcomers to the country, about 50 are dependent or become self-employed. In other words, the number of consumers of agricultural and manufactured goods is twice the number of those added to the labor market. This does not take into account the new jobs made available by enterprising immigrants opening new lines of trade.

The immigration committee says its finding has been that greater stablity, higher efficiency and more production almost always have resulted iff the past when there was a heavy inflow of iminigrants. So let's abandon the hesitant approach and get new Canadians to help build the new country that we are looking for.
