JUT OF the welter of charges and counter chargcampaign, certain specific issues have emerged for ed in Asia and Africa since the Hitler war is due to what larger-than-usual world away and long-term credit sales the electors to ponder before September 19. Among this simple truth: them is the moral issue of not who is right but what is right. On the one hand, for example, the Bennett administration boasts of great debt reduction, abolition of patronage and the restoration of true democracy to parliamentary debate.

Yet the opposition parties appear to have grounds for their claims that the rosy picture presented by the Socreds is not so rosy as it seems. What about Mr. Bennett's debt reduction claims? Does the convenient transfer of government liabilities for Grown corporations wipe out such obligations? One does not require the advice of unbiased financial experts to find the answer.

Are such charges against the Bennett government as the \$900,000 Cassiar road deal—in which a cost-plus contract was awarded without public tender to friends of a cabinet minister (by the minister's own admission)—evidence of no more patronage? Was the government's attitude in ridiculing and ignoring the Opposition's members efforts to speak up for their constituents during sessions of the house evidence of true democratic process?

We are not burdened at the moment with the question of party against party. We are, however, concerned with the moral issues involved. We hold to the proposition that the people do not expect absolute perfection even in the administration of their ic affairs.

Any political party is bound to be subject to Human frailty. But we hold in higher esteem the man who is courageous and humble enough to admit to misjudgment and error. The same goes for a political party, even though it chooses to parade under the guise of a "Christian movement."

One of the glaring weaknesses of the Bennett government has been its conceit. If re-elected, it would serve British Columbia better if Mr. Bennett took himself and his cabinet into a quiet corner now. and then for a self-confessional. Perhaps it would make them human enough to admit error and seek humility... people will cheer a winner and a doer. But the average person is revolted by boasting and self-professed perfection.
