(Romans 8:26)

Quickly let me add that this is from J. B. Phillips' translation of the Epistles. His language is so very up to date English and his doctrine so undefined that it makes good meditation reading.

Paul never gives way on the question of the ultimate victory through Christ, which must ever be the home of all children of God, but He does recognize our humanity and its limitations. Paul's life developed surely learned the meaning of limitations.
