FISHERIES PATROL FINDS NO TUNA IN DISTRICT YET

A Department of Fisheries patrol boat which has been making a sweep 200 miles off the B.C Coast reports that there is no sign of tuna so far this year in northern waters. Colder weather which has prevailed during the summer is

blamed for the non-appearance of warm-water fish. Meanwhile, gillnetters fishing the Skeena River report poor catches of salmon, some boats averaging only 11 fish.

Seiners from the Butedale area report catches of 500 mixed fish, including mostly chums and pinks although some sockeye and cohos have been taken.

Six seiners on the Naas averaged 330 chums, five others 600 fish, mostly pinks. In the Kwinilmass area, seiners report 389 mixed fish, mostly pinks.




