#### Airport Need Emphasized

A TRANSPORTATION tie-up such as that caused by the Union Steamship strike brings home more strongly than ever Prince Rupert's need for an airport. If anything should happen now to interfere with the air shuttle zervice between here and Sandspit—and it must be remembered that the Canso is an old aircraft—the plight of the city travelwise could be critical.

Admittedly there is the new CPA service between Terrace and Vancouver as well as the PWA flights on the same run via Kitimat. In addition, there are improved connections out of here by train and bus. But no matter what is done to make it easier to get to Terrace or to modernize flying fa--cilities there, that airport can never be considered a substitute for one on our own premises. The intervening distance of 100 miles puts it out of the ques-

Terrace is a neighbor, not a suburb, and by comparison with communities in more populated areas it is not a particularly close neighbor. We will go wrong in our thinking if we assume that because the population of north-central B.C. is widely scattered, it must put up with certain inconveniences in transportation. If anything, the reverse should apply,

In case there is any idea that an airport for Prince Rupert has local support only, it should be borne in mind that a resolution calling for one was passed for the second consecutive year at the Associated Boards of Trade meeting for north-central B.C. Moreover the issue was not pressed by the Prince Rupert delegates since they felt that the local airport committee had already presented the case as capably as possible to Ottawa. Clearly, therefore, the need for such a project is recognized far beyond our own city limits. It would close a big gap in the air lanes of the north country.

It is encouraging to learn from Ottawa that these circumstances apparently are appreciated and that serious thought is being given to asking for the required appropriation. Particularly in view of reduced activity in coastal shipping, which at the moment has reached a seriously low level, it is a matter that has moved from desirable to urgent.

### This is Not California

OMPLAINTS are again being received from tourists, both Canadians and Americans, regarding the type of tourist accommodation offered in Central

It seems unlikely these grievances are directed against the services offered to visiting motorists in Prince George and the other larger centres along highways 2 and 16 where motel, hotel, restaurant and garage accommodations compare very favorably with that provided in the more settled regions of the continent. In fact, it is much superior to that available in some of the more remote sections of the western United States,

Admittedly, there are a great many motels and roadside cafes west and south of Prince George which offer neither attractive surroundings nor well prepared and appetizing food. But the same applies to other areas in Canada where the tourist season is short and large capital expenditures to furnish luxmy accommodation for tourists is not justified.

Operators of establishments in Central B.C. which cater to the tourist trade will always have to contend with the chirpnic kleker who apparently hever takes into consideration that he is travelling in a country less than half a century removed from the wilderness stage, and that many of the humble motels and eating places far removed from centres of population might be classed as emergency services.




