The brief should also stress that every other facility needed by a large condern in setting up a new industry is right at hand in this city. There would be no necessity for initial planning of a community, or the setting up of shopping centres or other amentities for its workers. All that has been done long ago and the city is avid for more industry in this area.

At the same time, since preliminary surveys inust have been made by the Ventures group, council would be wise to seek an early reaction to its brief, as to why this city was not considered in the first place as a plausible site for a smelter and industrial townsite. It does not seem possible that expert engineers in their explorations could have missed this city, yet if there is anything wrong with Prince Rupert as a possible outlet for the multi-million dollar project, then it would be well for us to know what it is. Often when someone is at fault, the person congerned is the last to know.


