For some time a special research committee o the Canadian School Trustees Association has been exploring that particular problem. Its detailed report entitled "School Finance in Canada" has now been issued. To finance a basic standard of education it makes three major recommendations.

First, it would have greater assistance from the municipal authorities, through more uniform and equitable assessment, on all property. It points out the wide range in the present tax rates from a low of two mills to a high of 84 and it stresses the substantial amounts of tax exempt property in the various provinces.

Secondly, it urges the replacement of the present numerous provincial grants with a single, larger basic grant.

Thirdly, it calls for federal assistance in the form of an annual grant. Present cost could be approximately \$150 millions. One-third of this would be paid on a per pupil basis to all provinces, twothirds as an equalization grant to provinces with low tax paying ability.




