VANCOUVER (CP) — Work is really a hobby with Mary Harris Filer, nurse, artist and teacher.

Versatile and vivacious, she is a gold medallist in nursing and an expert in child art education; her own artistic talent is shown in a Filer watercolor hanging in the Toronto Art Gallery, another in the National Museum at Ottawa and works owned by private collectors in Canada, the United States and Britain.

Miss Filer, now assistant professor in art education at the Pennsylvania State University, settled her parents here after an absence of two years.

CAREERS LINKED

Her careers, nursing and art, are complemented each other.

After graduating as a gold medalist from Regina General Hospital, Miss Filer took two years of post-graduate work at the Neurological Institute in Montreal.

There she became interested in her work. Dr. Arthur Lissner was working with child art education at the Montreal Museum of Fine Arts.

After completing her post-graduate work, Miss Filer left nursing to devote herself to her first love, art. She took a fine arts degree at McGill University after teaching art at various children's classes.

While studying for her degree, she lectured in the fine arts department and instructed in several extension courses.

Upside-Down Cake Perfect For Dessert, Coffee Parties

If you like rich sweet desserts, here's your dish! "Tutti Frutti Upside-Down Cake" is upside down cake to end all, with pine-apple dates, cherries and crunchy California walnut in the brown sugar and butter mixture. It's perfect for a dessert-and-coffee party, when the dessert should be a little extra-special.

TUTTI-FRUTTI UPSIDE-DOWN CAKE

Bottom of Pan
1/4 cup butter or margarine
1/2 cup brown sugar (packed)
1 M.J. 1 fat can crushed pine-apple

1/4 cup sliced dates
8 halved maraschino cherries
3/4 cup coarsely broken California walnuts

Cake Batter
1 1/2 cups sifted cake flour
1 cup granulated sugar
2 teaspoons baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup shortening
Milk
1 egg
1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract

Melt butter in bottom of 9 x 9 1/2-inch pan. Blend in brown sugar. Drain pineapple thoroughly, reserving syrup for cake batter. Mix drained pineapple with butter and sugar. Sprinkle with dates, cherries and walnuts.

Cake Batter: Sift together flour, sugar, baking powder and salt. Add shortening. Pour pineapple syrup into measuring cup and add milk to make 2/3 cup liquid. Add 1/2 cup liquid to flour and shortening, and beat 1 minute (330 strokes). Add remaining liquid, egg and vanilla, and beat 2 minutes longer. Pour over fruit mixture. Bake in moderate oven (300 degrees F.) 1 hour. Let stand 5 minutes. Invert over serving plate to remove cake.

Serves 9.

"Wonderful" is the best word we know to describe the flavor of a whole wheat bread sandwich with a peanut butter and cranberry-rhubarb relish filling.
