As long as the youngsters have an adult, (preferably a member of the Rod and Gun Club) supervising them, no license is required," Mr. Bacon said.

The Rod and Gun Club's offer follows Daily News story yesterday pointing out that under the Provincial Game Act, BB

guns, spring guns and air rifles are considered firearms, and therefore anyone under the age of 18 is required to take out a firearms licence. Under the Criminal Code of Canada, any boy under 14, has to have a special permit from the Commissioner of the RCMP in Victoria, before he can possess an air or spring gun.
