

FORMATION OF NEW BOARD ASKED TO CURB TRUCKING

VICTORIA — Formation of a highway transport board to control the trucking industry in British Columbia has been urged on the B.C. government by an association of rail employees.

B.C. branch of the Canadian Ship-By-Rail Association, in a brief presented this week, also asks that truck traffic be banned in the province from midnight Saturday to midnight Sunday.

It asks that jurisdiction over the trucking industry be taken out of the hands of the motor carrier branch of the public utilities commission and turned over to a separate highway board.



Trapped King Gets Away But Guard Falls Into Luck

Mr. Muzzy was kibitzing this deal and he winched when Mrs. Keen opened the bidding on the South cards with one club. His theory is that when you have a big hand you have to make a big bid. Of course Mrs. Keen's bid was correct. If her partner could not respond to one club then it was practically impossible for there to be a game in the hand.

Mr. Masters had just enough for one bid and when Mrs. Keen heard it, she went straight to game at no trump.

Mr. Abel led the jack of hearts and Mr. Champion properly went up with the king on the chance that his partner had opened a suit headed by A J 10. But Mrs. Keen won with the ace.

DUCKS TRICK

She immediately led the queen of diamonds. When this was covered by the king she was not enticed into playing dummy's ace. She ducked the trick, permitting the king to win.

Again Mr. Muzzy showed disapproval, shaking his head and muttering something about having the King trapped and then letting it get away.

Of course, what Mrs. Keen was trying to do was to make sure of winning as many as four diamond tricks. If she won the first diamond with dummy's ace, led a diamond back to the jack and dropped the ten, she would win five tricks in the suit. But she was not in four no trump. Her prime objective was to win just nine tricks.

NO ENTRY

As you see, the 10 would not have dropped. Mr. Abel could have won the third round of diamonds and then there would have been no entry to the remaining good diamonds on the board.

At trick three Mr. Abel led the 10 of hearts and Mrs. Keen won with the queen. She laid down the jack of diamonds and was happy to see that both opponents followed suit.

Now she led the five of diamonds to dummy's ace and cashed the rest of the suit, thus winning four diamonds, two spades, two hearts and a club.

Turning to her crible, Mrs. Keen said, "Well, I managed to stumble through some way, didn't I?"

"Very lucky," said Mr. Muzzy giddily.
