WINNIPEG — Voting in several Manitoba cities, towns, villages and rural municipalities in the last week has shown a swing in favor of more liberal liquor outlets.

Four of the province's five cities voted to accept the five radically new types of liquor outlets provided by local option decision under the new Manitoba liquor law.

St. Boniface, St. James, Brandon and Portage La Prairie have all cast ballots, some with a three-to-one majority, approving sale of beer and natural wine in restaurants and beverage rooms, sale of liquor in high-class dining rooms, cocktail bars and cabarets with live entertainment.

Electors in Winnipeg voted on the five part referendum Wednesday but counting has not been completed.

Of 43 towns, villages and rural municipalities that have voted, a total of 27 wanted the new outlets while 12 decided to retain the previous set-up which allowed beer sales by the glass in men's beer parlors.

Singleton In Suit Bid By Partner May Be Liability

A singleton in a suit bid by your partner is likely to be a liability rather than an asset. On the other hand, four cards in partner's bid suit are worth a full two points in addition to any high card points you may have in the suit.

in trouble when Mr. Dale showed out, discarding a small heart. He played the queen from his hand and Mr. Champion won with the king and laid down the king of hearts forcing dummy to ruff with its last trump. At this stage Mr. Abel had no way to reach his hand to pull the rest of the trumps and down he went.

The bad trump break made this a tricky hand and there were several ways to play it and to defend it. Mr. Abel could have handled all the variations if he had won the first trick in dummy with the ace of clubs. Then he could have cashed the ace of hearts, ruffed a heart and led trumps, just as before. By preserving a club entry to his own hand he could have handled any defense Mr. Champion put up.

When Mrs. Keen heard Mr. Abel's bid of one spade in today's deal, she knew she had got the perfect response to her opening bid. Using my new Dynamic Point Count method in which three points are equal to one trick, she counted her hand to twenty-two points.

Count in hand
In addition to her fifteen points in high cards, she added two points for her spade length, two for her heart singleton and three points for the length and solidity of her diamond suit. The total of twenty-two points represented a seven trick plus hand. Her partner's one spade response had shown two tricks and so the jump raise to three spades on the North hand was eminently in order.

Actually Mr. Abel had much more than his first bid had promised. He had fifteen points or five tricks. His partner's jump raise had shown seven tricks so, after making a routine check on aces, he bid the small slam.

Mr. Champion led the jack of clubs and Mr. Abel, without much thought, won in his own hand with the king. He cashed the ace of hearts and ruffed a heart in dummy. Next he led the jack of spades from the board and let it ride. Mr. Champion played low.

Mr. Abel led another spade from dummy and knew he was

Dairymen Want Low-Fat Content Products

QUEBEC — The National Dairy Council today decided to consider asking federal and provincial governments to lower dairy composition standards so that milk products may be produced with low-fat content in keeping with current dietary trends.

The council's membership of hundreds of dairy processors and distributors decided also to seek ways of increasing plant automation to help ease pressures of retail prices and to boost a \$5,000,000-a-year sales promotion outlay to help widen the Canadian market for dairy products.

CONSIDER THREE POINTS

Winding up a three-day annual convention, the council decided its board of directors should consider these other committee recommendations:
1. Develop concrete plans for boosting the flow of milk to Canadian school children, including the use of government subsidies.

2. Complete work on a new plant sanitary code with the help of federal and provincial authorities. The code would be designed to meet federal health department criticism of the lack of sanitation in some cheese and milk factories.

3. Find ways of encouraging an increased flow of students into agricultural colleges to overcome an acute shortage of trained personnel in the dairy industry.

The question of seeking a lowering of minimum dairy com-

position standards apparently stemmed from repeated medical warnings that a high fat diet could contribute to heart disease for some persons. Thursday, Dr. L. B. Pett, chief of the federal health department's nutrition division, warned that the old emphasis on fats in milk must be changed. The value of milk, he said, was the solids and not the fats.
